

I'm Marissa Roy. I'm running for L.A. City Attorney to make the law work for the people, not the powerful.

In a moment where Los Angeles is under attack from the Trump administration and unchecked corporate abuse, the stakes have never been higher. The L.A. City Attorney has the power, under state law, to sue businesses for anything illegal or harmful to Angelenos.

That means when workers aren't paid at least minimum wage or work unpaid overtime, we take the corporate bosses to court for wage theft. When renters in L.A. are harassed and refused repairs, we sue the slumlords. When our neighbors are being kidnapped and our constitutional rights are being stripped, we take the fight directly to Trump, ICE, and the corporations enabling them.

This is the work I've done my entire career. I've worked as a government attorney, representing cities, counties, and now the state of California to fight for the people.

I started at the L.A. City Attorney's Office, where I built cases that held bad bosses accountable for wage theft and put tens of thousands of dollars back in workers' pockets, including undocumented car wash workers being paid as little as \$4.50 an hour.

I represented L.A. County as outside counsel in all of their litigation against the first Trump administration, including over a dozen legal actions to protect immigrants and defend sanctuary cities.

Now, I'm a consumer protection attorney at the California Department of Justice, where I'm suing billion-dollar tech companies and just won a half-million-dollar judgment to protect tenants from an abusive landlord.

This is the work I want to bring to the L.A. City Attorney's Office because right now it isn't doing enough to protect the public.

I will scale up the office's public rights work and make sure every neighborhood in Los Angeles has a direct line to the office.

I will get serious about safety, using every tool in our toolbox to address and prevent harm, break cycles of criminalization, and invest in solutions that actually work.

I will invest in our city workforce and manage taxpayer dollars effectively so that resources aren't being pulled from vital city services.

My campaign is built with and for a coalition committed to this vision, to combating the Trump administration, and to achieving true equity and justice for all people in Los Angeles.

I'm proud to have earned the trust of unions and workers' coalitions, including the L.A. Federation of Labor, progressive grassroots organizations, and elected and community leaders.

I'm ready to lead this fight with these partners to ensure that the City Attorney's Office is leading the fight against Trump, that we're protecting workers' rights, tenants' rights, climate justice, and civil rights, and that the law is showing up for everyone in Los Angeles.

I will be a city attorney that fights for and alongside the people.
