<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the City Attorney. Neither the City Administrative Officer (CAO) nor the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

In a report dated January 24, 2002, the City Attorney states that Patricia L. Glaser and her law firm, Christensen, Miller, Fink, Jacobs, Glaser, Weil & Shapiro, LLP., was retained to assist in

matters related to the Federal Consent Decree on Police Officer Conduct and Management. The City Attorney is requesting authority to expend up to an additional \$150,000 on this contract. The decree, entered into on June 15, 2001, settled a lawsuit by the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the City, brought under its "pattern or practice" jurisdiction in regard to constitutional violations by police agencies. At the time of the settlement, Council authorized the expenditure of up to \$150,00 for this case. The monies have been expended and more work is required.

The City Attorney states that \$71,273.61 will be required to pay outstanding invoices and the balance of \$78,726.39 will be expended on future billings. Although Ms. Glaser regularly bills clients at \$475/hour, the contract utilizes a stratified blended rate of \$295/hour for partners and \$225 for associates. These rates would continue under the amended contract. The City Attorney has identified sources for \$87,351 of the total amount, from unencumbered past funds already earmarked for other legal services contracts with this law firm that no longer require funding. The balance will be transferred from the Unappropriated Balance Outside Council Fund.

At its regular meeting on April 10, 2002, the Budget and Finance Committee discussed this matter and concurred in the City Attorney's recommendations. This matter is now being forwarded to Council for consideration.

After obtaining the City Council's approval, this office retained attorney Patricia L. Glaser and her law firm, Christensen, Miller, Fink, Jacobs, Glaser, Weil & Shapiro, LLP, to assist the office in matters related to what was then a proposed consent decree concerning police officer conduct and management between the United States Department of Justice ("DOJ") and the City. The decree, entered June 15, 2001, settled a lawsuit by the DOJ brought under its "pattern or practice" jurisdiction in regard to constitutional violations by police agencies. *United States of America v. City of Los Angeles, etc., et al.*, U.S.D.C. C.D. Cal. No. CV 00-11769-GAF (RCx). The case is assigned to U.S. District Judge Gary A. Feess.

Honorable Members:

This office requests authority to retain attorney Patricia L. Glaser and her law firm, Christensen, Miller, Fink, Jacobs, Glaser, Weil & Shapiro, LLP, to assist the office in matters related to the recently approved consent decree involving the United States Department of Justice ("DOJ"). We request that the Council authorize the expenditure of up to \$150,000 for this purpose.

On May 8, 2000 the United States Department of Justice ("DOJ") advised City officials that as a result of its four-year investigation of the Police Department, the DOJ had determined that the Police Department was "engaging in a pattern or practice of excessive force, false arrests, and unreasonable searches and seizures...." and that the DOJ had authorized the filing of a civil suit to eliminate the "pattern or practice." The DOJ offered to defer a filing "if City officials are interested in negotiating a voluntary settlement in the form of a consent decree to be filed with our civil complaint." Subsequently, the DOJ and the City negotiated a consent decree, which was approved by the City Council on November 2, 2000 and by the Mayor shortly thereafter. On November 3, 2000 the proposed decree was lodged with the federal district court along with a complaint filed by the DOJ. *United States of America v. City of Los Angeles, etc., et al.*, U.S.D.C. C.D. Cal. No. CV 00-11769-GAF (RCx). The case is assigned to U.S. District Judge Gary A. Feess.

¹ 42 U.S.C. § 14141(a) forbids governmental authorities and their agents from engaging in a "pattern or practice of conduct" that "deprives persons of rights, privileges, or immunities secured or protected by the Constitution or laws of the United States." 42 U.S.C. § 14141(b) authorizes the Attorney General to file a civil action seeking "appropriate equitable and declaratory relief to eliminate the pattern or practice." These provisions were included in the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, Pub. L. No. 103-322, 108 Stat. 2071 (1994).

This office anticipates that a number of matters may arise in federal district court in connection with the court's consideration of the proposed decree and its implementation upon its adoption by the court. Ms. Glaser and her firm would assist this office with these and related matters. At this point, there is no way to estimate the extent of the assistance that will be required. Most notably, in one area in which assistance will be desired -- attempts by third parties to become parties to the litigation -- the level of activity will be substantially driven by those third parties. Presently, we do know that the Los Angeles Police Protective League has filed an application with the court preparatory to filing a motion to intervene in the litigation (i.e., to become a party). Whether others will bring similar motions remains to be seen.

We request funding of up to \$150,000. Ms. Glaser, who regularly bills clients at \$475 per hour, has offered to undertake this assignment for a blended rate of \$250 per hour (i.e., all attorneys would bill at that rate) or a stratified blended rate of \$295 per hour for partners and \$225 for associates. Because we cannot now accurately estimate the amount of work that will be required, the \$150,000 funding sought should be regarded as essentially a nominal sum. As for a source for these funds, please note that funding for outside counsel to assist this office has been earmarked in the City's adopted budget for fiscal year 2000-01.

For these reasons the Office requests that the Council:

- 1. Authorize the City Attorney's Office to enter into a legal services contract with Christensen, Miller, Fink, Jacobs, Glaser, Weil & Shapiro, LLP to assist the office in this matter.
- 2. Transfer \$150,000 from the Unappropriated Balance to the General Fund, and transfer the same amount to the City Attorney, Fund 100, Department 12, Account 3040, Contractual Services.
