Comments for Public Posting: On behalf of Communities for a Better Environment I am calling in / submitting comment online in today in support of agenda item #8, the motion introduced by Councilmember Raman, Price, and Bonin to instruct L.A. City Planning to establish a process to truly satisfy Senate Bill 1000, the Planning for Healthy Communities Act. And to urge the L.A. City Council to create and adopt a stand-alone Environmental Justice Element. L.A. City's 2021 SB 1000 compliance update was deficient and L.A. City Council must direct L.A. City Planning to craft a stand-alone Environmental Justice element to satisfy SB 1000 requirements. L.A. City is relying on outdated data from the 2015 Plan for a Healthy L.A. and 2013 L.A. City Safety Element to create Environmental Justice programs and policies. This prevents L.A. City Planning from (1) identifying and (2) effectively reducing disproportionate pollution burden in disadvantaged communities throughout Los Angeles. Meaningful public participation is the cornerstone of SB 1000. Failing to perform adequate community outreach and public engagement deprives impacted communities of the opportunity to weigh in on local planning decisions that will directly impact their communities, built environment, and personal health. L.A. City Council must prioritize public health and safety by directing L.A. City Planning to create a stand-alone Environmental Justice Element, to ensure: (1) current disadvantaged communities are identified and (2) meaningful environmental justice programs and policies are created and enforced, especially in LA's most vulnerable communities.
