Comments for Public Posting: Dear LA County Board of Supervisors, My names is Rev Felicia Parazaider and I live in District 4 (Council Member Nityha Raman) and am the founder of The Revolution of Love Ministry & Movement. I strongly support Item 10: Hero Pay” for Frontline-Grocery Workers and Drug Retailers in Los Angeles County. Economic security is everyone’s right and these essential workers have faced threat and injustice daily since this pandemic, without adequate care, basic rights, or compensation. It’s unconscionable and needs to be fixed. Grocery and drug retail workers have gone above and beyond during these unprecedented time and have been risking their lives providing a lifeline for our communities and keeping us fed. A vast majority of these essential heroes come from our communities who have been devastated by the pandemic. Many grocery workers have become the primary earners in their households as families and our fellow citizens face widespread unemployment. To add to the current situation, working people, especially families of color, have also not been able to shelter in place throughout the pandemic because they are more likely to hold essential jobs and thus face an increased exposure to COVID. Meanwhile grocery and drug store corporations have seen their profits skyrocket during the pandemic. For example, Kroger, which owns Food4Less and Ralphs, even spent 1.3 billion on stock buybacks. While these companies have seen their profits grow and top executives receive pay raise workers such as cashiers, folks who stock the shelves, and deli workers see themselves counted among essential workers facing dangerous conditions that they could not have imagined. As COVID-19 cases are still at an alarming level, with new variants being discovered and Intensive Care Unit capacity is still at breaking point in Los Angeles County, grocery and drug store workers continue to face the risk of infection and endure a hazardous working environment. This is the right policy for this unprecedented moment. Grocery and drug retail workers deserve hazard pay. Large grocery chains can afford it. Los Angeles County must lead as it always has in fighting for the rights and dignity of working people. Thank you Rev.
