Comments for Public Posting: To the Los Angeles City Council: As you consider rent relief due to the COVID-19 shut down, please take into consideration the following: Rent cancellation will result in lower tax revenue for the City. Rent cancellation will cause an upstream financial crisis for landlords, management companies, service providers and insurance companies when small property owners who depend on rent for their sole source of income cannot pay their bills without rent. Tenants who move from a premises after the moratorium ends will leave small property owners with unpaid losses. The longer you allow tenants to repay past due rent, the greater the loss of income for property owners. It is more likely than not that the past due amounts will never be paid by the vacating tenants who will be long gone by the time the landlord tries to recover what's due. Tenants and landlords both need relief. Rent cancellation or forgiveness should be the decision of each property owner, on a case by case basis, to the extent they can afford to do so, not a blanket edict from government. Do not lump all the bad apples together with the responsible landlords. Some of us are as concerned about our tenants as the tenants are about themselves. But abuse is a given.
