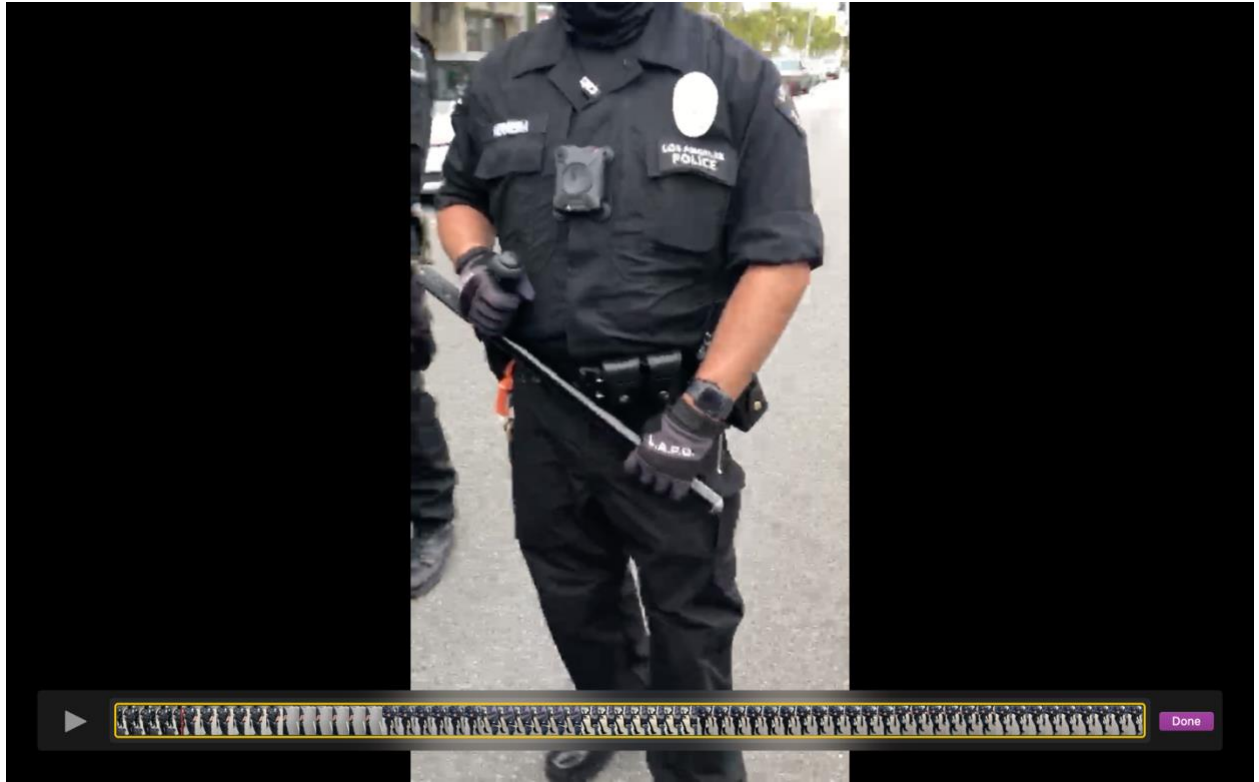

Comments for Public Posting: On Saturday, May 30th, I was at Beverly Blvd. and N. Hayworth Ave. around 5:30pm. I observed a line of officers blocking the street on Beverly Blvd. facing S. Fairfax Ave. Officer Han was the lead officer at the scene. One of Officer Han's police officers was questioned as to what the red light on his body camera meant. The officer replied that the red light indicated the body cameras were off. All the officers located at this intersection blocking the street at this time had their body cameras off. The attached video (at the first and third seconds) shows proof that the body cameras were off. This was a deliberate act taken by Officer Han's group of officers to ensure any events that took place between the officers and the PEACEFUL protesters could not be traced. The officers then proceeded to shoot off approximately 20 rounds of rubber bullets AFTER the crowd of peaceful protesters had already dispersed. The officers then surrounded these peaceful protesters from all streets, creating mass chaos, confusion, and fear, the exact state that these peaceful protesters were calling attention to utilizing their right to assemble. To add insult to injury, all but two officers at the scene did not have face masks on. In a time of global pandemic, I find it disgusting that these public officials would not be taking health precautions that the Mayor of Los Angeles declared a requirement.
