Comments for Public Posting: Good morning, honorable City Council members. I am Gina Amoroso, resident of Venice in District 11. I am calling on behalf of my neighbors, friends, and family in Venice to express my disappointment, anger, and concern of the secretive and discreet installations of 5G wireless cell antenna towers in all of Los Angeles. Without prior notice to homeowners, these antennas are being installed near homes. For example, a soon-to-be active device is currently attached to a pole which is 3 feet from my garden and just outside of my kitchen door. The antennas have been known to cause health hazards, fire risks, and property devaluation up to 20 percent. In Beverly Hills, for example, there are 397 towers and 1928 antennas activated by multimillion dollar carriers. Councilmembers and especially Councilmember Bonin, I urge you to create a policy to mandate that companies like Verizon provide prior notice to homeowners about antenna device installations and a procedure for homeowners to contest the notice, if desired. In the meantime, I demand that this device outside of my home stays inactive and quickly removed.
