This lot is too small for the proposed building. The architect rendering gives the illusion that the gas station next door is part of the property. It is not! 55 residents and no parking spaces for residents. Do you really think that homeless people don't have vehicles? Residents of the facility will be parking on Topanga Canyon Blvd, a State highway that is a major north south artery for thousands of vehicles each day. This will impact local businesses and the school personnel who park on the adjacent street. The footprint of the building takes up the entire lot. This is the reason the 5+ story building will be towering over the residential properties on the back side. In addition, construction will interfere with the movement of traffic on Topanga Canyon Blvd for the entire period of construction. The developer, Affirmed Housing, purchased the property and ramrodded this project through with the assistance of out of area activist groups and has not met with the Chatsworth NC to discuss any of the issues noted above.
