By my work, for instance, there is two in a 1 mile radius. It's pretty wild to me that this city of all cities that has the most reliance on cars and thus the most opportunity for expanding the electric car network, would be the city that has hardly any chargers. I think I speak for everyone when I say that the amount of chargers should be at least quadrupled and they should not be subject to additional fees from the city. If anything they should be a credit to reward ev utilization.
