

Incident Reports

11/27/22 – Intruder accessed the school through the front door entrance which had a malfunctioning closer while an employee and her minor children were onsite in the front office. The intruder, who claimed to be a participant of Project Room Key, walked through the rear of the building halls and classrooms, removed his shirt, and lit and smoked an unidentified subject in one of the classrooms. (See attached communication chain with photos)

2/17/23 – Needle found in plastic bottle at the outdoor amphitheater where scholars have break and lunch (see attached security report).

2/21/23 – Fire was started in outdoor area near hotel pool at rear of campus. Fire was extinguished through efforts of both AMA and hotel security. This is the second fire that the school has encountered around its property (see attached security report).

2/25/23 – Possibly due to weather conditions, AMA trash bins were found on the sidewalk and on Figueroa as opposed to on the property where they are located daily. When rolling them back into place, AMA CEO and security found needles located where the trash bins are usually located (See attached photos).

3/3/23 – Needles found at trash enclosure area. Need proper protocol for removal. (See attached photos)

3/12/23 – Individual found in trash enclosure after being reported by passerby to security.

3/15/23 – 1:18AM: Individual came to exterior of front lobby and proceeded to slash tire of vehicle parked in area. When guard tried to intervene, individual came towards guard with knife. Police were called and report was filed. (See attached documentation).



3/20/23 – 10AM: Security Team observed transient hiding what appeared to be drugs behind trash bins at front entrance of school. Security approached individual and individual became agitated but ultimately left property. Individual told security he had just been admitted to shelter and knew he would be searched before going in so wanted to hide drugs to retrieve them later.

3/21/23 – 6:53PM: Staff member Treisha Chanman was standing on the second floor balcony and witnessed an individual on Bird getting something out of the bushes directly in front of her car which was parked in front of the campus lobby. She was able to obtain video, but only of the individual pulling off from the area. Director of Salvation Army was contacted. (See attached screenshot)

3/24/23 - 2:54PM: Younger man who appeared Caucasian was found by campus security loitering in the basement. He was asked to leave, dropped a few items, retrieved them, and when told the police would be called if he didn't exit the premises said, "No need for that, I'll get out. I'm the best person to be near a school." Individual then exited. (See attached report)

3/26/23 - 7:33AM: Vehicle drove off freeway and landed on school property, crashing into south side of building. Vehicle entered building window and crashed into a classroom wall. The driver was conscious and called law enforcement to notify of the accident. School does not have access to cameras at the exterior of the property where the vehicle came in, but has interior footage of the vehicle landing in the building. Guard onsite heard a loud noise and investigated, and shortly after police and fire trucks arrived at location. Guard gave access. The driver appeared Caucasian, 25-35 years in age and was administered oxygen by EMTs. He was taken in the ambulance. Intoxication status is undetermined. (See attached report)



3/28/23 – 6:23PM: A heavy set man dressed knocked on the front lobby doors. Campus security approached the door and opened enough to ask individual who he was. He attempted to get past security, and when he wasn't able to asked if he could enter because he forgot something in the building. Security asked who he was and he said he was a student and asked to enter again. When security denied him, he then asked for a manager. He was asked to wait outside while security phoned CEO/Founder Dana Hammond. Mr. Hammond happened to be exiting the parking garage across the street and drove over to the front of the building, exiting his vehicle and asking the man to exit the property. Mr. Hammond recognized the individual as the person who had trespassed the property and walked the halls, smoking and removing items of his clothing in November of 2022 (noted on this report). The individual refused to leave and instead loitered around the perimeter of the building until security began filming him. LAPD was called and responded (See report attached).

Dear Russ

Thank you for your response. I failed to mention AMA did request additional security services on November 26, 2022, and November 27, 2022 and did have a guard to cover the facility over the weekend. Although this is additional cost to AMA this was necessary to ensure the safety of the property and the equipment inside the property.

In the spirit of transparency, I informed you we place a lock on the door to mitigate any additional threat should the intruder return on November 25, 2022. Fortunately, the lock served as protection because intruder did in fact return at 6:00 pm on November 25, 2022 asking me to come back into the facility.

After speaking with LAPD this morning, they acknowledged they should have responded sooner on November 25, 2022 and that I would not go to jail for placing a lock on the door due to the safety threat we were experiencing. I did inform LAPD we did place a lock on the door because we honestly are in fear of our life. As you can I imagine this is extremely dangerous especially in a climate of school shootings. This also has staff retention implications for me because if staff does not feel safe they will not come to work.

Thank you for following up with Rong regarding the door because the front door has not been closing properly prior to our lease commencing. We did inform Jose and he took a look at the door and made some adjustments. However, we were not aware someone has the ability to enter the premises despite the door being locked.

I am not an attorney but if we are in fear due to a threat of an intruder and there is no one physically inside the building I can't imagine I would be liable for anything illegal seeing that my staff and safety is in danger. Despite the immediate danger we are faced with as an educational institution we are focused on mitigating risk and acting swiftly based upon the circumstances.

Here are some immediate solutions I took on November 26-27th.

1. I have contacted AMA security vendor and requested 24-hour security to begin on November 27, 2022
2. AMA did have its security occupy 345 s Figueroa on November 26 between 8 am- 1:00 pm and November 27 between 8:00 am - 4:00 pm
3. On November 27, 2022 AMA will receive confirmation from AMA's vendor about whether they can provide on 24 hour security beginning November 27, 2022

Lastly, I believe it will be important to schedule a zoom call with you and our team to discuss solutions regarding the security of facility. I believe it's important to collaborate to find

solutions that secure the building and review the lease to lead those discussions with AMA board member , Matt, and Treisha .

This is an urgent matter and I am looking forward to your availability to schedule a zoom meeting so that I can coordinate a time with our team.

I have attached a photo of the front door and AMA's security guard to provide evidence the lock has been removed and there is a guard at the front door.

Dana, I don't create the laws. The bigger safety issue here would be viewed as people being trapped in a fire due to a lock on a fire exit. While I understand and appreciate the unlikeliness of this happening, the City would prefer that a security guard be stationed at the door until the matter can be remedied. In my earlier email I asked Rong to explore how and why the door can be opened when it is locked. I am sure he will address this tomorrow. I fully understand and share your concern. However, having a chain on a fire door exit is illegal and it is something I cannot condone.

Good Morning Russ

I hope this email finds you well. On November 25, 2022 between 10:57 am - 12:30 pm an intruder entered AMA facilities through the front door.

AMA staff was in the building with her three young scholars and was unaware the intruder was in the building.

Unfortunately, the intruder entered the building through the front door despite it being closed and locked. After reviewing the camera footage, the intruder was able to pull the door and press on the handle inside the door and gain access .

Luckily for AMA , no one was harmed, and I was able to walk the gentleman out of the facility without incident. The intruder expressed he was part of project room key and was looking for the shelter. After further investigation we discussed the intruder was making a false claim. He was actually not part of project room key.

However we had experienced previous incidents where members from project room key had entered the building while ama staff and scholars were present. It is extremely

alarming that any person can gain access through the locked front door.

Because of the easy accessibility of the building, I believed it was essential to find a temporary solution that would prevent the homeless from accessing the front entrance.

On November 25 I purchased a chain with a lock. Unfortunately The intruder returned as I was leaving and wanted to gain access again. I told him I was calling the police and I did. I contacted the police and waited 30 minutes . Unfortunately, no police officer arrived. I drove to the police station and they were closed .

Currently there is a chain on the front door of the entrance because anyone can access the building .

I am aware having a chain on the front door of the facility presents another fire safety challenge however this is the only temporary solution I could think of especially since the intruder returned the same day.

To protect AMA investment and provide assurances To families they would be safe while attending AMA, we paid a 12,000 deposit to install a six foot iron fence that matches the existing six foot gate around the facility outdoor amphitheater. As discussed in the past the goal was to ensure members from project room key or any other intruder would not enter the school.

We understand you are aligned with understanding the importance of safety to our business and the hotel.

The fencing company has contacted AMA regarding completing the installation and we have not had a response whether we were permitted to move forward.

I am not clear on the approval status from the hotel ownership on completing the gate installation.

Since the public can access the front door of the facility after business hours , I believe the six-foot fence is an immediate solution to ensure the safety of AMA scholars.

I wanted to know your availability to schedule a call with Treisha , AMA board members, and Matt to discuss the safety concerns as I beleive this are strong warning signs of what can occur if we do not move quickly on solutions that protects the AMA and the hotel .

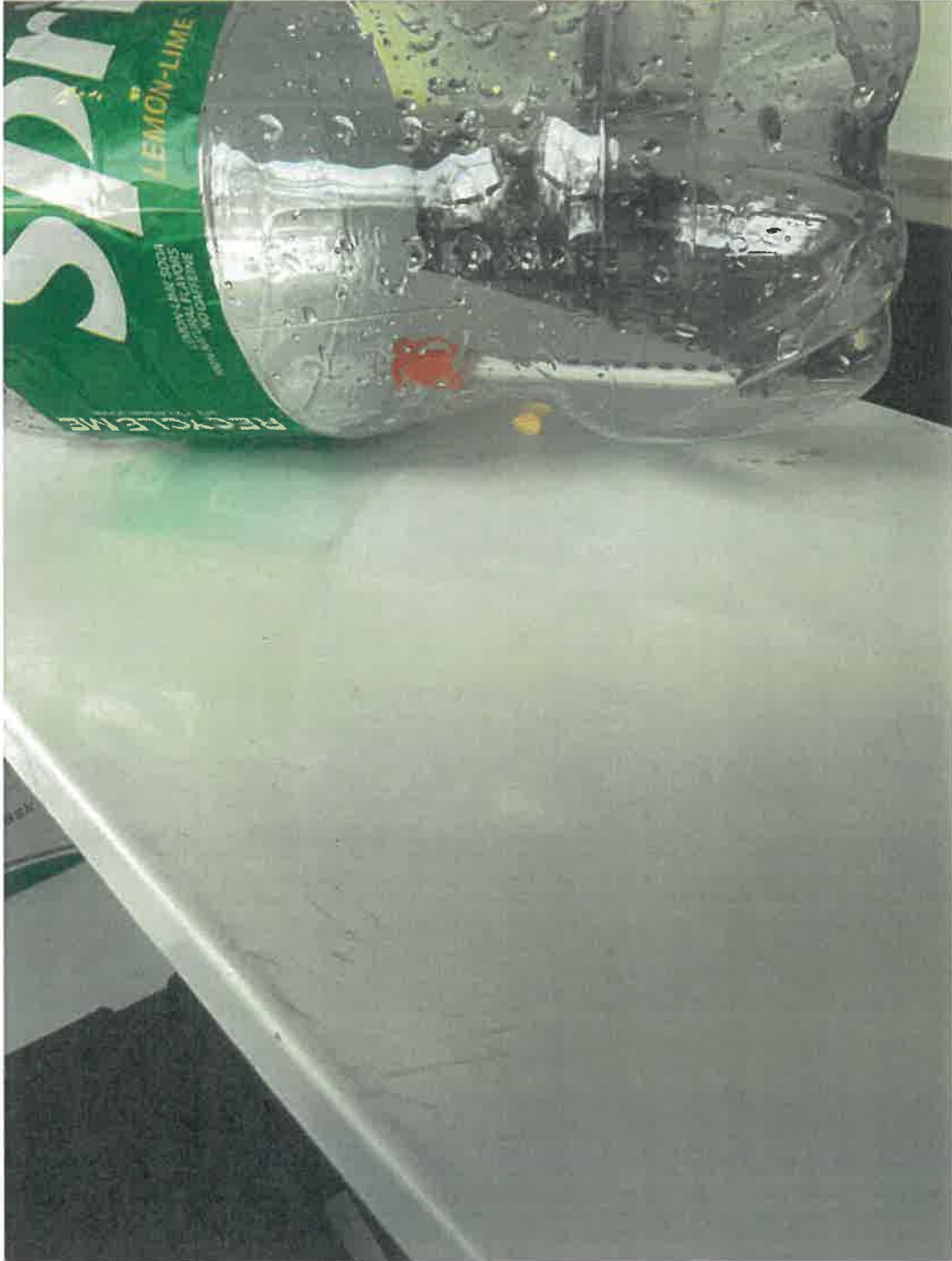

At approximately 10:42 am, Officer Moreno was informed by hotel security that there was a fire near the grass area behind the school. As soon as I observed the fire, I immediately retrieved a fire extinguisher from the school and quickly put it out concerned about the potential damage to the property and the risk of the fire spreading.

After the fire was put out, I continued to monitor the area to ensure that there were no further incidents. I also worked with hotel security to determine the cause of the fire. Footage shows a homeless man walking by where the fire occurred. No face footage captured via cameras.

The incident highlights the importance of maintaining a vigilant approach to security and making immediate action when dealing with potential fire hazards. I will continue to monitor the property and take all necessary measures to ensure the safety and security of the Scholars and staff.

Report on Homeless Man Attempting to Hide Drugs Behind High School Trash Bins

On Monday 3/20/23, at approximately 10AM, the AMA security team observed a transient attempting to hide what appeared to be drugs behind the school trash bins. Upon further observation, the security team immediately approached the individual and requested that he leave the school premises. The transient became agitated and became aggressive but ultimately left property.

During the investigation, it was determined that the transient had in his possession drug paraphernalia. The subject admitted that he had just been admitted to the shelter and knew he would be searched before he could obtain a room. To avoid being caught with the drugs, he tried to hide them behind the school trash bins to pick them up later.

This incident is of great concern to the security team at AMA, as it highlights the potential risks that participants of PRK may pose to the safety of our students and staff and campus. While we acknowledge the valuable role that shelters play in providing support to those in need, we must also take steps to ensure that individuals who have a history of drug use or other criminal activity are not allowed to enter school property.
