I was looking forward to attending the meeting tomorrow, 12/10. Unfortunately, I just got an important meeting, hence I am emailing you.

When this plan of housing and potentially rehabilitating homeless women came up months ago, I was thrilled that such a plan could be implemented, and was all for it.

I live up the street on Lodi, and have had some bad experiences, ie, when walking our dogs, on the opposite side of the street, some residents hooting at us [I think one was called Sonia?]; ripping up plants in front of our home; dog poop; lots of 'new' trash appearing on our front lawn [all of which did not occur prior to the homeless women occupancy].

I love the idea of rehabilitating, but these women just sit around, and I hear that some sell drugs. I think that it would be a great idea to have these women volunteer for a couple of hours a day [perhaps at goodwill or answering phones at a charity or help cleaning the lodi facility]. I had spoken w/ one of the occupants, who said that some woman was rude and kind of violent towards her. I asked if her case worker could help her out. She replied that some of the case workers are afraid of some of the women.

I can't imagine what it must be like to be homeless. I guess one would have to be tough.. but I , personally, do not feel comfortable around 'tough anybody'. You have provided food

and shelter, but,how do you plan to rehabilitate them?
