If you're concerned about the ongoing WLA VA Soldiers Home land mis-use Racket in our Nations Capital of Veteran homelessness and are rightly suspicious of Dianne Feinstein & Ted Lieu's "Campus Improvement Act" (CIA) to give private developers 99-year leases, amid their awareness of overwhelming opposition among Congressionally Chartered Veterans Services Organizations to that non-Veteran special interest developed bill... - 1) No press coverage of any damage to WLA VA during Sylmar quake, which only damaged the Sepulveda VA and LA County Olive View hospitals (not WLA VA Wadsworth).
- 2) U.S. Department of Commerce quake investigation finds no WLA VA damage.
- 3) Corrupt L.A. City & County officials desperate to illegally annex Federal WLA VA Soldiers Home lands.
- 4) UCLA illegally starts selling off Federal WLA VA Soldiers Home land after it's medical center winds down on the 35-acre C&H tract; to private developers who build massive apartment complexes that agree to provide 40% of the units for UCLA student housing. (I wonder how much money the Chancellor's pals made on those deals.)
- 4) Contrary to corrupt VA GLAHS Directors (including McKenrick's) lies about WLA VA serving homeless Veterans after the 1950's, the facts prove otherwise.
- 5) L.A. County obviously couldn't legitimately build anything back then either, considering their three-year old, "earthquake proof" Olive View hospital crumbled.
- 6) Sepulveda patients and staff were initially transferred to the (undamaged) WLA VA Soldiers Home Wadsworth Hospital.
- 7) UCLA, lobbyists and corrupt Public Officials form a "Southern California Regional Medical District" that suddenly declares the WLA VA Soldiers Home's Wadsworth Hospital, or wait, I mean, that and another 29 buildings there are condemned due to "potential damage".
- 8) Southern California Regional Medical District evicts thousands of disabled Veterans into homelessness without the slightest plan to give a damn about them. Bang! Los Angeles County becomes the Nation's capital of Veteran homelessness.
- 9) L.A. Times starts up the 'Ol propaganda against Veterans of the Soldiers Home again (like they did back in the late 19th Century)... Really interesting how awful those Veterans, I mean vagrants, get after the quake... Ain't it?
