GENERAL EXEMPTION, TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to renewal of Temporary Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 63 north of the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) Terminal at Pico Boulevard and Rimpau Boulevard.

Recommendations for Council action:

1. FIND that the proposed establishment of Temporary PPD No. 63, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 80.58.d, is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under the General Exemption (Article II, Section 1 of the 2002 Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines).
2. FIND that the parking problem that led to the establishment of Temporary PPD No. 63 north of the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) Terminal at Pico Boulevard and Rimpau Boulevard in Council District No. 10 still exists and that no permanent solution had been found.
3. ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION renewing Temporary PPD No. 63 for 12 more months pursuant to Section 80.58.d of the LAMC.
4. DIRECT the DOT to prepare a Notice of Exemption reflecting Council's actions under Recommendation No. 1 above and file such notice with the City and County Clerks within five working days of the City Council's action.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The DOT reports there are currently over 100 preferential parking districts Citywide that require a staff of approximately 19 DOT employees to: 1) process requests for new districts and modifications to new districts, 2) install and maintain signs, and 3) enforce the preferential parking restrictions. The total cost of the Preferential Parking Program during FY 2004-05 is estimated at \$2.5 million. Approximately \$1.2 million in General Fund revenue is anticipated to be received from the sale of over 192,000 Preferential Parking Permits (PPP) currently reimburses the City for only 48 percent of the cost of implementation and administration of the PPP Citywide. A proposal to increase preferential parking permit fees to a level sufficient to fully recover the costs of operating the Preferential Parking Program will be presented in a separate report.

If the Council approves the DOT's proposed permit fee increases, the additional cost of implementing, administering and enforcing Temporary PPD No. 63 will all be covered by the revenue from the sale of permits for the District. Furthermore, the City may gain additional General Fund revenue from the issuance of parking citations to violators of the District's parking restrictions.

Summary:

On March 23, 2005, Council resolved (Council file No. 05-0399) to establish Temporary PPD No.

63 on the following blocks (a map is attached to the Council file):

- a. Rimpau Boulevard between Dockweiler Street and Pico Boulevard
- b. Rimpau Boulevard between Dockweiler Street and 12th Street
- c. Keniston Avenue between Dockweiler Street and San Vicente Boulevard
- d. Dockweiler Street between Hudson Avenue and Rimpau Boulevard
- e. Hudson Avenue between Dockweiler Street and Pico Boulevard

This resolution also authorized the installation of the following parking restriction anywhere within Temporary PPD No. 63:

"2-HOUR PARKING 8 AM TO 6 PM MONDAY TO FRIDAY; VEHICLES WITH DISTRICT NO. 63 PERMIT EXEMPTED"


Temporary PPD No. 63 is currently due to expire on March 23, 2006.

The City Council has the authority, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d, to establish Temporary Preferential Parking Districts by resolution "to provide relief for residents who suffer an excessive parking impact ... as the result of any conditions which impact fewer than six blocks and which, in the judgement of the Councilmember of the District and after consultation with the Parking Administrator, deserve immediate relief until a permanent solution can be found." Temporary Preferential Parking Districts are limited in duration to a maximum of 12 months from the date of approval of the resolution. Temporary districts may be renewed on an annual basis by resolution until either a permanent solution is found or the problem ceases to exist.

At its March 8, 2006 meeting, your Committee considered a February 27, 2006 DOT report and Resolution relative to the renewal of Temporary PPD No. 63. After further consideration, your Committee moved to approve the recommendations as contained in the DOT report. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.

RESOLUTION

RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT NO. 63 NORTH OF THE MTA TRANSIT TERMINAL AT PICO BOULEVARD AND RIMPAU BOULEVARD

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2005, the City Council adopted a Resolution establishing Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 63; which is currently due to expire on March 23, 2006; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Wesson has determined that the conditions that originally justified this Temporary Preferential Parking District; which include the daily intrusion of non-resident, commuter vehicles from people utilizing the MTA Transit Terminal located at Pico Boulevard and Rimpau Boulevard that park in the residential neighborhood, interfering with trash pick up and adversely impacting the residents' ability to access their properties or park in front of their own homes, still exist, and no permanent solution to resolve the resulting parking shortage in the neighborhood is available; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Wesson has requested the renewal of Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 63 to provide continued relief to the residents of the District from the adverse parking impact they were experiencing prior to the establishment of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d authorizes Temporary Preferential Parking Districts to be renewed on an annual basis by resolution until either a permanent solution is found or the problem ceases to exist;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d hereby renews Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 63 for an additional 12 months until March 23, 2007; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Temporary Preferential Parking District No. 63 remain unchanged.

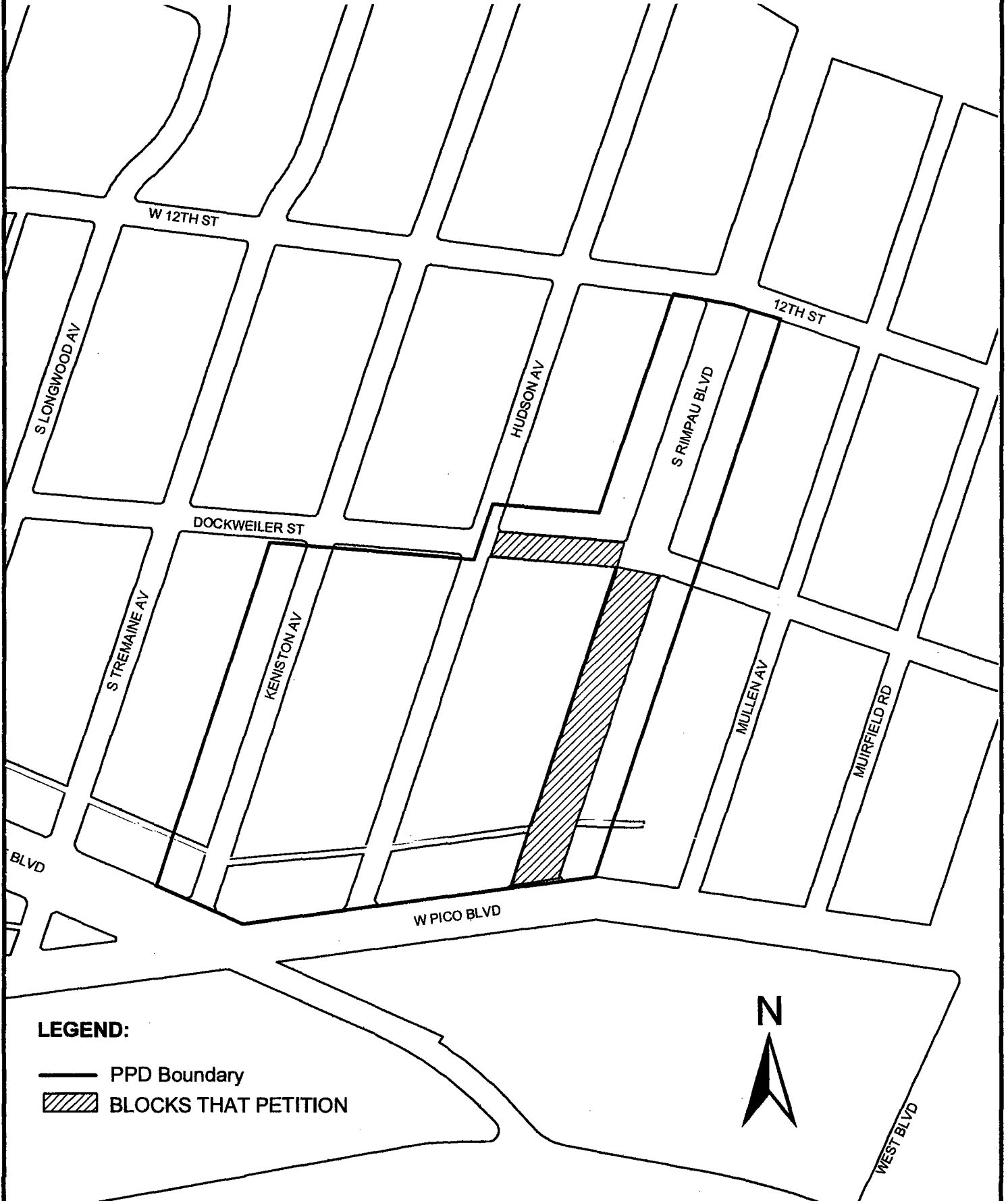
