The Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council is hosting the Lincoln Heights Holiday Parade on Sunday, December 10, 2006, 12:00p.m to 3:00p.m. The ceremony will features the community's annual holiday celebration.

Council District One has received a request that the City provide certain services and declare this function a Special Event. Approval of this request will mean that an estimated \$3,000 in fees and salary costs will be absorbed by the City. (Event Coordinator: Lupe Guillen : Phone: 323-309-6055; Fax: 323-222-1203).

I THEREFORE MOVE that the "Lincoln Heights Holiday Parade" sponsored by Lincoln Height Neighborhood Council be declared a Special Event; and, that the City departments be requested to waive all fees, costs, and requirements. Except insurance.

I FURTHER MOVE that the event sponsor be directed to fulfill the insurance requirements of the City by contacting the Bureau of Street Services –Street Use Inspection Division 213/485-3711 to obtain and complete the necessary insurance forms, upon adoption of this motion by the City Council.

I FURTHER MOVE that pursuant to Ordinance No. 150,567 relating to temporary street closures, the following streets be closed on Sunday, December 10, 2006, 10:00a.m to 4:00p.m. subject to the supervision of the Director of the Bureau of Street Services:

- Lincoln Park Avenue between North Mission Road and North Broadway
- North Broadway between Lincoln Park Avenue and Avenue 24
- Avenue 24 between North Broadway and Manitou Avenue
- Barbee Street between North Mission Road and Lincoln Park Avenue
- Closure of City Parking lot 658 at 216 S. Avenue 24

I FURTHER MOVE that the Bureau of Street Services be directed to furnish the necessary traffic control devices. With the understanding that the sponsoring organization will pickup and return the barricades.

I FURTHER MOVE that the Department of Transportation be directed to post "Temporary No Stopping" signs and traffic personnel, if necessary.

I FURTHER MOVE that should unforeseen circumstances change the actual dates or time for the Special Event, the aforementioned departmental instructions continue to apply.
