PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Police Department's findings concerning compliance with the Firearms Warning Ordinance (No. 178996).

Recommendation for Council action:

NOTE and FILE Board of Police Commissioners report to the Public Safety Committee dated August 20, 2008 relative to the Police Department's findings concerning compliance with the Firearms Warning Ordinance.

SUMMARY

In a report to the Board of Police Commissioners dated August 11, 2008 (attached to the Council file), the Police Department reports that pursuant to Council instruction, the Department conducted a follow-up inspection of all firearm dealers previously found to be out of compliance with the City's Firearms Warning Ordinance. The Department found that all locations, except one, were in full compliance. A citation was issued to the out-of-compliance owner for failing to post the required firearm warning within the business. Two days later, Department staff returned and found that the proper warning notice had been posted. The Department reports that all permitted firearms dealers located in the city of Los Angeles are now in compliance with the Firearms Warning Ordinance. On August 19, the Board approved the Department's report.

At its meeting held September 8, 2008, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council note and file the Police Department's relative to compliance with the City's Firearms Warning Ordinance.


