Dear Mr. Martinez.

In accordance with the Council Motion adopted on January 31, 2006 (Council File #02-0196), the City Planning Department hereby submits this review and comment regarding the renaming of the proposed Beverly Crest Neighborhood Area.

Historical research indicates that the proposed name, "Beverly Crest," would accurately reflect the historical and cultural significance of the area. The subject area is part of the Bel Air-Beverly Crest Community Plan area. The Community Plan text does not include specific information on the history or boundaries of the area; however, historical research suggests that George E. Read originally named the area Beverly Crest when he began to subdivide the area in 1923. Local historian, Marc Wannamaker, has published photographs of the original Beverly Crest logo used to advertise the area in 1924. Further, the name "Beverly Crest" is also geographically accurate because this area is located in the hills above the City of Beverly Hills. and is within the larger section of the Bel Air-Beverly Crest Community that is commonly referred to as "Beverly Crest."

RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Department recommends that the City Council approve the renaming of the area as "Beverly Crest."
