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

GENERAL EXEMPTION, COMMUNICATION FROM CHAIR and MEMBER, TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE and Resolution relative to the renewal of Temporary Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 137.

Recommendations for Council action:

1. FIND that the renewal of Temporary PPD No. 137, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 80.58.d, is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under the General Exemption (Article II, Section 1 of the 2002 Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines).
2. FIND that the parking problem that led to the establishment of Temporary PPD No. 137 still exists and that no permanent solution has been found.
3. ADOPT the accompanying Resolution renewing Temporary PPD No. 137 for 12 more months, until September 19, 2010, pursuant to Section 80.58.d of the LAMC.
4. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to prepare a Notice of Exemption reflecting Council's actions under Recommendation No. One and file such notice with the City and County Clerks within five working days of the City Council's action.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The LADOT reports that revenue from the sale of permits will cover the additional cost of implementing, administering, and enforcing Temporary PPD No. 137. The department also states that the City may gain additional General Fund revenue from the issuance of parking citations to violators of the District's parking restrictions.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.


**SUMMARY**

## RESOLUTION

### RENEWAL OF TEMPORARY PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT NO. 137 FOR THE PICFAIR VILLAGE NEIGHBORHOOD SOUTH OF PICO BOULEVARD AND THE AMENDMENT OF APPLICABLE PARKING RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2008, the Council adopted a Resolution (C.F. 08-2310) establishing Temporary Preferential Parking District (PPD) No. 137; which is currently due to expire on September 19, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Wesson has determined that the conditions that originally justified this Temporary PPD; which include regular intrusion of vehicles associated with customers and employees of nearby businesses on Pico Boulevard, and that no other viable measure to resolve the resulting parking shortage in the neighborhood is available; and

WHEREAS, Councilmember Wesson has requested the renewal of Temporary PPD No. 137 for 12 more months to provide continued relief to the residents of the District from the adverse parking impact they were experiencing prior to the establishment of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Councilmember has requested on behalf of the residents of Temporary PPD 137 that the following additional restriction be authorized for use in this district: "No Parking; except 2 Hour Parking, 8 AM to 6 PM; Monday to Friday; District No. 137 Permits Exempt".

WHEREAS, Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d authorizes Temporary PPDs to be renewed on an annual basis by resolution until either a permanent solution is found or the problem ceases to exist.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 80.58.d hereby renews Temporary PPD No. 137 for an additional 12 months until September 19, 2010; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of Temporary PPD No. 137 through the adoption of this Resolution, that the following preferential parking restriction also be authorized for use on the residential portions of street segments anywhere within the district, except where stopping or parking are otherwise prohibited due to safety reasons or inadequate roadway width:

"NO PARKING; EXCEPT 2 HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 6 PM; MONDAY TO FRIDAY; DISTRICT NO. 137 PERMITS EXEMPT"

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Temporary PPD No. 137 remain unchanged.
