

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to proposed contracts for landscaping and maintenance services of City bike path and transit facilities.

Recommendations for Council action:

- AUTHORIZE the General Manager of the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT)
 to enter into a five-year contract with ShelterCLEAN, Inc. for the management and performance
 of maintenance and landscaping services for two City bike path facilities, subject to the approval
 of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
- 2. AUTHORIZE the General Manager of the LADOT to enter into a five-year contract with ShelterCLEAN, Inc. for the management and performance of maintenance and landscaping services for seven City transit facilities, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The City Administrative Officer (CAO) reports that for the bike path facilities, funding has been included in the City's apportionment of Transportation Development Act Article III funds, which are apportioned each fiscal year and include a stipulated amount for maintenance. Therefore, there is no impact on the City's General Fund. Additional funding is also available through the City's adopted Fiscal Year 2009-10 Proposition C Budget. Therefore, there is no impact on the City's General Fund.

The CAO also notes that for the transit facilities, funding has been included in the City's approved Fiscal Year 2009-10 Proposition A Local Transit Assistance Budget. Therefore, there is no impact on the City's General Fund.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

At a regular meeting held on September 9, 2009, the Transportation Committee considered proposed contracts for landscaping and maintenance services of City bike path and transit facilities. An opportunity for public comment was held. Afterwards, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations contained in the CAO report. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
