RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners REVIEW and APPROVE the attached APPLICATION for the Special Reward Payment.
2. That the Board TRANSMIT to the Mayor and City Council the Application for Special Reward Payment for review and approval.

DISCUSSION

On November 2, 2010, a \$75,000 reward was offered by the Los Angeles City Council for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the shooting death of Aaron Shannon, who was five years old, on October 31, 2010. Information received from a Claimant led to the arrests and convictions of Leonard Hall and Marcus Denson under Superior Court Case Nos. BA422563 and BA377814, respectively. On January 20, 2026, the City Council approved the reinstatement of the \$75,000 reward for the person who provided the information which led to the arrests and convictions of these suspects. Attached is a copy of the City Council Motion approving payment of the reward.

On July 21, 2015, Leonard Hall was convicted of second-degree murder and sentenced to 40 years to life in prison. On January 14, 2016, Marcus Denson pleaded guilty to voluntary manslaughter and attempted murder. He was sentenced to 25 years in prison. It is the opinion of the handling prosecutor, Deputy District Attorney David Barkhurst, that convictions would not have been possible without the information provided by the Claimant.

It is the opinion of the investigator, Detective Iris Romero, that the Claimant qualifies for the \$75,000 reward under City Council File No. 10-0010-S42. The information provided by the Claimant led to the identification, apprehensions, and convictions of the suspects. Based on these facts, it is requested that a check in the amount of \$75,000 be made payable to the Claimant listed on the attached Application for Special Reward Payment.

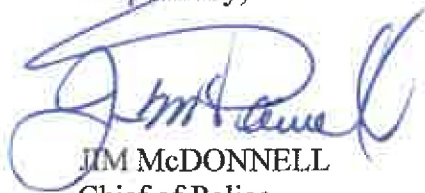

On October 31, 2010, approximately 2:00pm, Aaron Shannon- 5 years old, Terrance Shannon- 27 years old, and William Shannon- 56 years old were in the backyard of 1007 E. 84th Street when unknown suspects walking eastbound through the alley fired numerous shots. All victims were struck by the gunfire and transported to the hospital. Aaron Shannon succumbed to his injuries on November 2, 2010. Terrance and William Shannon were treated at the hospital for the injuries and released.

The person or persons responsible for this crime represent an ongoing threat to the safety of the people of Los Angeles; therefore it is appropriate for the City of Los Angeles to offer a reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Aaron Shannon and the injuries sustained Terrance and William Shannon.

I THEREFORE MOVE that by adoption of this Motion, the City Council provide an offer of reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension, and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Aaron Shannon and the injuries sustained by Terrance and William Shannon, residents of the City of Los Angeles, on October 31, 2010, and in support thereof, make the following findings pursuant to Division 19, Chapter 12, Article 1 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code:

1. That the death of Aaron Shannon and the injuries sustained by Aaron, Terrance and William Shannon were caused by the willful misconduct of one or more persons.
2. That this offer of reward is consistent with and taken for the immediate protection of the public peace, health and safety of local residents, as well as visitors to the City, and is consistent with the need to arrest and convict the person or persons who, because of not being apprehended, could by their actions further terrorize and present a continuing and immediate menace to the rights of persons in the City.
3. That what happened to Aaron, Terrance and William Shannon, is an especially disturbing crime and therefore, as a matter of public policy, the City hereby offers a reward as an added inducement for persons to come forward with information leading to the identification, apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Aaron Shannon and the injuries sustained by Terrance and William Shannon
4. That the sum of \$75,000 shall be the aggregate maximum sum of any payment or payments of a City reward in this instance.
5. That the offer of reward shall be in effect for six months from the date of the advertisement of the reward by the City Clerk.

On Sunday, October 31, 2010, at approximately 1400 hours, Aaron Shannon, a five-year-old, was in the rear yard of 1007 East 84th Street with his grandfather and uncle. Two males were observed walking eastbound in the alley that abuts the rear yard. One of the unknown males fired numerous rounds into the yard, striking all three individuals. Aaron was struck in the head and killed. Detectives investigating this case hope that a monetary reward of \$75,000 may motivate witnesses to come forward and identify the individual responsible for this murder.
