

Your **PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE**

reports as follows:

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the 2010 Solving Cold Cases with Deoxyribonucleic Acid (DNA) Program grant award for use by the Police Department.

Recommendation for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

APPROVE the recommendations of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) in the January 5, 2011, report to the Mayor and Council (attached to the Public Safety Committee Report) relative to the 2010 Solving Cold Cases with DNA Program grant award in the amount of \$1,130,868 from the United States Department of Justice (DOJ), National Institute of Justice (NIJ) for use by the Police Department for the period January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2011.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that this action will not impact the General Fund. The 2010 Solving Cold Case with DNA Program costs are fully reimbursable. Acceptance of the grant does not require matching funds. The above recommendations comply with City financial policies as one-time revenue is used for one-time expenses.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.


SUMMARY

In the attached report to the Mayor and Council, the CAO states that the Police Department seeks retroactive approval to seek and accept a 2010 Solving Cold Cases with DNA Program grant award and to execute a Cooperative Agreement between the City and the DOJ/NIJ. According to the CAO, the major objectives of this program are to review and prioritize 800 "cold" homicides and sexual assault cases that have the potential of being solved through DNA analysis; retrieve and evaluate biological evidence; DNA analysis of biological evidence likely to yield results from those cases reviewed; and, follow-up investigations. The CAO reports that the NIJ will provide reimbursement for expenses incurred reducing the cold case backlog, such as overtime, contract laboratory services, travel, and department administration and support. On November 2, 2010, the Board of Police Commissioners approved the Police Department's request to seek and accept this grant. The CAO concurs with action.

At its meeting held January 10, 2011, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council approve the CAO's recommendations relative to the acceptance of this grant.
