We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

We share this information to assist you with the docketing neighborhood council items before your board/commission. If you have questions and/or concerns, please contact the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at empowerla@lacity.org.

Re: Hollywood Hills West Neighborhood Council Opposition to the Current Status of the Zone Zero Regulations

Dear State and City Officials,

I am writing to you in my capacity as President of the Hollywood Hills West Neighborhood Council (HHWNC) to formally convey the concerns expressed during our Board meeting held on 11.19.25. Zone Zero, as mandated by recent state legislation, was the primary topic of discussion, including a detailed presentation by Dave Lefkowitz, the President of the Mandeville Canyon Association, who outlined the proposed requirements and enforcement structure.

Our board and community were collectively shocked and deeply concerned by the scope and implications of the Zone Zero law as currently drafted. The turnout and level of engagement reflected the seriousness with which our community views this issue: **all 23 HHWNC board members were present, marking 100% participation, and over 100 community members and stakeholders** attended to voice their questions, concerns, and experiences.

Following robust discussion, the HHWNC Board voted **unanimously** to adopt the following motion:

Motion:

*HHWNC supports the position of the Los Angeles City Council (CF # 10-2468-S2) and other California area communities in **opposition** to the current status of the Forestry Project called Zone Zero. HHWNC pleads with Forestry, Cal Fire, State Legislators, and Governor Newsom to hear and respect the concerns of all stakeholders to be impacted within hillside areas and adjacent communities.*

Our community fully supports sensible wildfire prevention efforts and recognizes the urgency of protecting high-risk areas. However, the current version of Zone Zero raises significant concerns regarding feasibility, environmental impact including impacts to wildlife and local ecology, financial burden on homeowners, unintended consequences, and the lack of meaningful engagement with affected hillside communities prior to implementation.

We respectfully urge your offices to pause further implementation of Zone Zero in its current form. Thank you for your attention to this urgent matter and for your ongoing service to our region. We hope you will give serious consideration to the concerns raised by our Board and the thousands of residents and stakeholders we represent.
