Summary: Time Sensitivity: HIGHEST (NCs currently will have a chance to speak at both committee and City Council with a timely CIS) Proposed Statement: This Community Impact Statement deals with equity in the Neighborhood Council (NC) System. Budget Advocacy is one of the most important tasks for the entire NC System and is clearly spelled out in the City Charter in Article IX, Section 909 "Each neighborhood council may present to the Mayor and Council an annual list of priorities for the City budget. The Mayor shall inform certified neighborhood councils of the deadline for submission so that the input may be considered in a timely fashion." Budget Tribunes is a new budget advocacy alliance for the NC System. They have put on multiple Town Halls, worked with the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners, the City Council, Controller, & the Mayor's Office. This Council File would give Budget Tribunes (and any future budget advocacy groups) the same rights as the first budget advocacy group that was created in terms of being able to raise and use City funds to do their mission of informing the NC System on budget and service matters. Council File 11-1020-S3 should be supported in full as written and be used as a model to encourage more NC System alliances to form, represent their Neighborhoods, and be formally recognized by the City.
