
Recommendation

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a Special Election was ordered to be held in the City of Los Angeles pursuant to Ordinance No. 181429 to place a measure before the voters and the election was consolidated with the City of Los Angeles Primary Nominating and Consolidated Elections held March 8, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the following measure was submitted to a vote of the qualified voters of the City of Los Angeles:

FIRE AND POLICE PENSION PLAN; NEW TIER 6 FOR SWORN FIRE, POLICE, AND HARBOR DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES HIRED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2011 AND OTHER MODIFICATIONS. CHARTER AMENDMENT G.

Shall the Charter be amended: (1) to provide sworn Fire, Police, and Harbor Department employees, who are hired on or after July 1, 2011, with the pension benefits provided in the Fire and Police Pension Plan - Tier 6; and (2) to modify provisions of the Fire and Police Pension Plan in order to facilitate compliance with state and federal laws, to authorize the Council to establish an Excess Benefit Plan, to allow flexibility in establishing amortization policies, and to make technical changes?






