

## RESOLUTION

### MIRMAN SCHOOL

**WHEREAS**, Mirman School was founded on September 10, 1962, by Dr. Norman and Mrs. Beverly Mirman out of their love for children and a deep concern for their education. The school moved from the living room of their home in Brentwood to a storefront location on W. Pico Blvd. in 1963. It remained there until the opening of its current Mulholland Drive campus, an architectural achievement that complements the natural beauty of the Santa Monica Mountains; and

**WHEREAS**, Mirman School has grown from its nine original students who were taught in Dr. and Mrs. Mirman's living room to more than 300 on the Mulholland campus. Proud of its academic and intellectual legacy, its broadly diverse student and teaching community spanning 78 zip codes, the school now celebrates its largest graduating class in its history. The students matriculate or graduate into the most selective public and independent secondary schools and colleges, locally, statewide, and nationally; and

**WHEREAS**, Mirman School is recognized as a nationally distinguished independent school with the unique institutional mission to educate highly gifted children, and contributes its professional expertise to the professional development workshops offered by the National Association of Independent Schools, the National Association of Gifted Children, the California Association of Gifted Children, and the California Association of Independent Schools; and

**WHEREAS**, Mirman School's various constituencies, students, parents, faculty and administrators, continue to receive numerous awards and honors for exemplary achievement, including its identification as one of only 87 schools nationally designated as an Apple Distinguished School; and

**WHEREAS**, Mirman School, as a founding member of the Mulholland Educational Corridor Association [MECA], has consistently worked to build and sustain the collegial relations between the educational institutions located along the Mulholland Corridor, to coordinate relationships with government entities, and cooperate with local neighborhoods and the larger community for the betterment of all who dwell, attend school, worship and work along the Corridor:



WHEREAS, after finishing the *Drill Tower* in 1978, Michael was assigned as a rookie at Fire Station 3 serving the downtown and Bunker Hill area; and

WHEREAS, Michael W. Brehm achieved his success in the most challenging of assignments and faithfully served the City of Los Angeles at Fire Stations 9, 10, 74, 59, 4, 2, and eventually finishing his career at Fire Station 12; and

WHEREAS, during his assignment as a firefighter he fought a series of historical fires and numerous major emergencies; and

WHEREAS, Michael Brehm responded to dozens of large scale emergencies such as freeway incidents, large industrial and commercial fires, river rescues, urban search and rescues incidents, collapsed structures, mud slides and emergency medical incidents; and



