

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the May Day 2013 Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Activation After-Action report.

Recommendation for Council action:

APPROVE the May Day 2013 EOC Activation After-Action report (attached to the Council file).

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Emergency Operations Board (EOB). Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

Accompanying a report to the Mayor dated October 2, 2013 (attached to the Council file), the EOB presents the May Day 2013 EOC Activation After-Action report. The EOB reports that on May 1, 2013, the City of Los Angeles EOC was activated as a planned measure to provide citywide coordination of information and resources for the 2013 May Day Event. The Emergency Management Department (EMD) consulted with the Los Angeles Police and Fire Departments and the Office of the Mayor during the pre-event planning. The EOC was activated to provide support to field response agencies and to ensure effective coordination and management of Citywide response should the event escalate. The report identifies the departments involved and a chronology of activities. It also provides recommendations of corrective actions specific to the activation of the EOC. EMD will track areas recommended for improvement and, as appropriate, report back through the Emergency Operations Organization. The Mayor transmitted EOB's report to Council for consideration.

At its meeting held November 8, 2013, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council approve EOB's report.
