COMMUNICATION FROM MEMBERS, TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE relative to prohibiting the parking of oversized vehicles on segments of Kenter Avenue and Homewood Road.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Resolution (Bonin – Englander):

1. RESOLVE, pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 22507, to prohibit the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height, during the hours of 7 AM to 3 PM, Monday to Saturday, on both sides of Kenter Avenue between Tigertail Road and Robinwood Drive, and on both sides of Homewood Road between Kenter Avenue and Bonhill Road.
2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation to post signs giving notice to the public of the parking restrictions on both sides of Kenter Avenue between Tigertail Road and Robinwood Drive, and on both sides of Homewood Road between Kenter Avenue and Bonhill Road.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

On November 19, 2013, Council considered Resolution (Bonin – Englander) relative to prohibiting the parking of oversized vehicles on segments of Kenter Avenue and Homewood Road. Resolution states that the increasing prevalence of oversized vehicles parking during weekdays and Saturdays is diminishing the quality of life for the residents and creating significant public safety issues in this residential area. Significant public safety issues, littering and loitering, and the loss of available residential parking, by persons conducting business from the oversized vehicles and their patrons have further impacted this neighborhood. Resolution recommends that Council establish oversized vehicle parking restrictions on these street segments. Council referred Resolution to the Transportation Committee for consideration.

At the Transportation Committee meeting held December 11, 2013, Committee members recommended that Council approve the proposed oversized parking restrictions, pursuant to Resolution (Bonin – Englander).
