DRAFT ORDINANCE ADDING SECTION 88.66 TO DIVISION U OF CHAPTER VIII OF THE LOS ANGELES MUNICIPAL CODE TO DESIGNATE SPACES ON A PUBLIC STREET OR PARKING FACILITY FOR PARKING A VEHICLE THAT IS CONNECTED FOR ELECTRIC CHARGING, AND AMENDING SECTIONS 80.76.2 AND 89.60 TO SET FINES FOR A VEHICLE PARKED IN VIOLATION OF REQUIREMENTS

## Honorable Members:

Pursuant to your request, this Office has prepared and now transmits for your consideration the enclosed draft ordinance, approved as to form and legality. The draft ordinance would add a new Section 88.66 to Division U of Chapter VIII of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) designating, by Council resolution, stalls or spaces on a public street or publicly owned parking facility for the exclusive use of charging and parking a vehicle that is connected for electric charging, and would authorize impound procedures. Pursuant to your request, this Office has added language in the draft ordinance to exempt electric charging stations installed pursuant to this section from the provisions of LAMC Section 62.08 (Specifications and Procedures for Above Ground Facilities Installations in the Public Rights-of-Way). ordinance also amends LAMC Sections 80.76.2 and 89.60 to set fines for a vehicle parked in violation of the LAMC requirements.
