

DISCUSSION

The donation would enable the LAPD to train all sworn field officers during an 18-month period in order to achieve compliance with Peace Officer Standards and Training requirements and state law. Additionally, police officers are typically the first responders to both emergency medical and tactical situations. They play a crucial role in not only providing security and safety but also in rendering aid to critically injured civilians and fellow officers. Every day, LAPD officers are faced with dangerous situations where civilians and officers fall victim to traumatic injury. The training provided will enable officers to render aid without having to rely on the Fire Department for use of its equipment.

No expressed or implied commitments or promises were made to the donor or representatives of the donor. The donor will not receive any preferential treatment, endorsement, or recommendation; and the donor is not allowed the use of any Los Angeles Police Department patents.

It is requested that Administrative Services Bureau approve and forward this correspondence to the Board of Police Commissioners to accept the donation of \$98,584.34 from the Los Angeles Police Foundation to fund the purchase of First Aid/Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) training materials.

**DONATION**

The donation will provide the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD or Department) with First Aid/CPR and AED training materials. Police Officer Standards and Training (POST) and California Penal Code Section 13518 require that police officers receive 14 hours of First Aid/CPR and AED training every three years. During 2012, an inspection was conducted at the LAPD's Central Area Police Station by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health. The inspection revealed that the Department was out of compliance with POST and state law. These training materials will be utilized by certified sworn officers to train other sworn members to ensure that the Department is in compliance with POST and state law. This training will also allow police officers to render aid to critically wounded civilians and fellow officers who may fall victim to traumatic injury.
