Dear PLUM Councilmembers: It would be interesting to ask City Planning Department what percentage of undeveloped residential lots within the jurisdiction of the Wildlife Ordinance would pass the newly proposed minimum slope band requirement of 60% (or 31 degrees). My guess would be 1-3%, which would mean that 97-99% of property owners of undeveloped lots (that had been purchased in good faith, who were paying property taxes, as well as costly annual brush clearance) were owners of property that would be virtually 'condemned' under the new changes proposed.
