Traffic congestion and delay in the City result in slower vehicular speeds, longer trip times and increased queuing. These negative consequences have a large impact on everyone who travels in the City, regardless of mode, as well as on the City's overall economic viability.

The Westside Coalition (Coalition) is a group of community leaders, activists and volunteers dedicated to improving the lives of Los Angeles residents. The Coalition has proposed the implementation of the Enhanced Traffic Pathway Analytics Program (ETPAP) at no cost to the City. The ETPAP would reduce traffic by providing traffic mitigation and monitoring information to the Los Angeles Department of Transportation. The ETPAP consists of advanced traffic monitoring and management systems located throughout Century City and surrounding communities, which includes video and license plate reading cameras, as well as unique software that will be developed to analyze traffic patterns. This system could serve as a tool to provide essential information to the City as it examines unique and creative ways to improve the flow of traffic.


