An ordinance establishing the South Los Angeles Industrial Tract Property and Business Improvement District (District) and levying assessments, pursuant to the Provisions of the Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994 (Division 18, Part 7, Streets and Highways

(Division 18, Part 7, Streets and Highways Code, State of California).

WHEREAS, the Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994 authorizes cities to establish Property and Business Improvement Districts for the purpose of levying assessments on real property for certain purposes; and WHEREAS netitings were filed by

properly for certain purposes; and WHEREAS, petitions were filed by property owners in the South Los Angeles Industrial Tract business community who would pay more than 50 percent of the total amount of assessments to be levied, requesting that the City Council establish the South Los Angeles Industrial Tract Property and Business Improvement District.

Section 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF
DISTRICT AND LEVY OF
ASSESSMENTS. The City Council hereby
establishes the South Los Angeles
Industrial Tract Property-based Business
Improvement District and levies an
assessment on each property within the
District for each fiscal year referred to in
the Management District Plan.
Sec. 2. MAJORITY PROTEST. The City
Council hereby finds that there was no
majority protest against the establishment
of the District and levy of assessments.
Sec. 3. ADOPTION OF ENGINEER'S
REPORT AND MANAGEMENT

DISTRICT PLAN. The City Council hereby reaffirms its adoption, approval, and confirmation of the Engineer's Report and the Management District Plan included in Council File No. 14-1072.
Sec. 4. BENEFIT TO PARCELS WITHIN THE DISTRICT. The City Council finds and declares that the properties within the District will receive a special benefit from the improvements and activities funded by the assessments to be levied.

Sec. 5. PROPORTIONAL BENEFIT. The City Council hereby reaffirms that the assessment imposed on each parcel does not exceed the reasonable cost of the proportional benefit conferred on that

Sec. 6. ASSESSMENTS SUPPORTED BY ENGINEER'S REPORT. The City Council hereby reaffirms that all BY ENGINEER'S REPORT. Sec. 7. DISTRICT BOUNDARIES. The City Council hereby declares that the boundaries of the proposed District are as detailed in the Management District Plan. 7. DISTRICT BOUNDARIES. A general description of the boundaries of the proposed District is as follows: The proposed South Los Angeles Industrial Tract Business Improvement District consists of approximately 22 blocks in south Los Angeles bounded roughly by Slauson Avenue on the north, Florence Avenue on the South, Central Avenue on the east and Avalon Avenue on the west. All property within the approximate boundaries described above is included in the proposed District

Sec. 8. THE DISTRICT'S ASSESSMENT. The City Council hereby reaffirms the District's total assessment for four (4) District's total assessment for four (4) years is estimated to be \$3,609,223. The District's total annual assessment for the first year is estimated to be \$837,381. Sec. 9. IMPROVEMENTS AND ACTIVITIES. The City Council hereby reaffirms that the District's activities and improvements are detailed, in the

reatimms that the Districts activities and improvements are detailed in the Management District Plan and include, but are not limited to, Security, Streetscape Services, Marketing, Program Management and Operations. Sec. 10. FUNDING OF IMPROVEMENTS AND ACTIVITIES. The City Council declares that the improvements and settilities to be previded in the District will declares that the improvements and activities to be provided in the District will be funded by the levy of assessments on properties within the District. The revenue properties within the District. The revenue from the levy of assessments within the District shall not be used to provide improvements and activities outside the District or for any purpose other than the purposes specified in Ordinance No. 186597. The District will not issue bonds. Sec. 11. AMENDMENT TO ENABLING STATUTE. The properties and businesses within the District established by this Ordinance shall be subject to any amendments to the Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994 (Division 18, Part 7, Streets and Highways Code, State of California) Sec. 12. DISTRICT OPERATIONAL PERIOD. The District's operational period shall begin on January 1, 2021 and end on December 31, 2024. Sec. 13. PERIOD TO REQUEST DISESTABLISHMENT. There shall be a 30-day period in each year of the District's operation during which property owners may request disestablishment of the District. The first period shall begin on year after the effective date of this ordinance and shall continue for 30 days. The next 30-day period shall begin two years after the effective date of this ordinance and continue for 30 days. For each successive year of the District's operation, the 30-day period shall begin on the anniversary of the effective date of this ordinance and continue for 30 days. Sec. 14. SPECIAL FUND ESTABLISHMENT. The revenue from the assessment shall be collected and placed in the Special Trust Fund to be established and to be known as the South Los Angeles Industrial Tract Property and Business Improvement District Fund (Fund). All interest and other earnings attributable to assessments, contributions and other revenue deposited in the Special Fund shall be credited to the Fund. and other revenue deposited in the Special Fund shall be credited to the Fund.

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and have it ubilished in accordance with Council policy, either in a daily newspaper circulated in the City of Los Angeles or by posting for ten days in three public places in the City of Los Angeles cone copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall; one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall East; and one copy on the bulletin board located at the Temple Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall East; and one copy on the bulletin board located at the Temple Street entrance to the Los Angeles County Hall of Records.
