Dear Mr. Bonta, Ms. Soto, Mr. Hochman, and Mr. Logan,

As a native Angelena and as a Los Feliz/Silverlake resident for the past 12 years, I've always been interested in being informed about local issues that affect our city and its residents.

However, I was intentionally misguided and misinformed by the circulator who approached me on 6/10/25 at 3:30pm in the Albertsons parking lot in Los Feliz. I mistakenly signed a petition that I was made to believe would be supporting a minimum wage increase when in fact it was doing the exact opposite.

As a constituent, I am extremely troubled by the reports of brazen misrepresentation and violent behavior by circulators of the referendum petition seeking to overturn the ordinance increasing wages and healthcare benefits for hotel and airport workers and hotel worker training (Ordinance 188610).

Circulators have claimed that the referendum would increase worker wages when it would actually eliminate a minimum wage increase.

The use of misinformation by circulators to prevent public education is unacceptable, and signatures obtained by misrepresenting the content of the petition do not represent the will of the voter.

As the very petition process has been corrupted, we urge you to keep the measure off the ballot. At the very least, referendum petition signatures gathered by circulators who broke the law must be excluded.

I trust in your commitment to upholding the integrity of the referendum process, public safety, and local democracy. Please take this matter seriously.
