ARTS, PARKS, HEALTH, AGING AND RIVER COMMITTEE REPORT relative to requesting that the City Attorney draft an Ordinance to address the disposition of bulky and personal items left on park property after the park closes.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Bonin - O'Farrell):

REQUEST the City Attorney to draft an Ordinance to preclude any person, without a permit, from bringing bulky items, including but not limited to sofas, couches, armchairs and mattresses onto park property in the City of Los Angeles and to provide notice that personal property left in the park after the park closes may be subject to removal and short-term storage by the City.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On January 12, 2015, your Committee considered Motion (Bonin - O'Farrell) relative to requesting that the City Attorney draft an Ordinance to address the disposition of bulky and personal items left on park property after the park closes. The Motion, attached to the Council file, contains background information. During the discussion of this item, Councilmember Bonin provided a thorough overview of the Motion. Representatives from the Department of Recreation and Parks and the City Attorney's office then spoke in favor of the request and responded to related questions from the Committee members. After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council approve the request contained in the Motion, as reflected above. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
