

Re: Home-Sharing Ordinance


Dear Councilmember Huizar,

We would like to express both my support and concern regarding the draft Home-Sharing Ordinance that the City Planning Commission agreed upon in June of this year. While we are grateful to the City for its efforts to create reasonable measures, the ordinance still contains elements that present significant barriers to all stakeholders in the short-term rental (STR) industry.

The City should hold vacation rentals to the same standard as all other short term rentals given that they both serve the same purpose, to provide quality accommodations for guests. Vacation rentals have a smaller footprint than other short term rentals, while also having the potential to bring in more Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT). While we can't distinguish which vacation homes in Los Angeles are primary versus secondary, we do know that guests tend to stay longer – on average of 6 days – in comparison to guests in hotels who stay an average of just 1 day. This means vacation rental guests are paying six times the amount hotel guests pay in TOT to the City. Think about it. If you are called to LA for business, you are going to be in and out in general. If you can figure a way to bring the family and make a vacation out of it, you will stay longer.

The Mayor has made ending homelessness a top priority and has stated that all TOT collected from STRs will go into a homeless housing voucher trust fund. In considering regulating the STR industry, we should determine how to maximize the collection of TOT while balancing other concerns surrounding this industry. Using TOT to fund constructive programs that help provide long term housing and job trainings for homeless people is the ethical thing to do. It benefits our most in need, the local economy, and all Angelenos ultimately. Remedying our homeless population will also offer an increased boost in tourism to the City of Angels.

We believe the City should not limit the number of days that vacation rentals can be rented out each year. It will put people out of business. Furthermore, a survey conducted by HomeAway of its user base found that if they were banned from renting on a short-term basis, the majority of them would use their homes for personal use. This dispels the notion that many of HomeAway's users would sell or rent their property, and therefore create more housing stock. The reality is the issues related to housing stock are rooted in long term problems with not meeting demand and underfunding affordable housing projects.



In the meeting with the Planning Commission it was mentioned that some 50,000 people moved to Los Angeles last year, some 16,000 new homes came online. Some estimates say there needs to be 100,000 new homes built a year for a decade to make any sizable dent in this long standing crisis. Something that should be addressed, but not with smoke and mirrors trying to deflect the problem on a contributor to Los Angeles on multiple levels that accounts for less than .02% of the city's housing stock when looking at number of rentals over 120 days.

There are a variety of reasons why owners may choose to rent out their homes, but for a lot of us, this is not only a source of income – this is our livelihood. The limitations posed by this ordinance could have a significantly adverse impact on Angelenos who greatly depend on this industry, including the workforce that depends on this industry for steady work, among them housekeepers, landscapers, handymen, dry cleaners, property managers, insurance agents and local restaurants and retail. I am asking that the City recognize and address the restrictions which prove unreasonable and indifferent to STR owners.

We encourage the City to take into account the ineffective, unenforceable and arbitrary elements of the current ordinance, and to collaborate with your local organization, LASTRA (Los Angeles Short Term Rental Alliance) to address these issues. We remain here to help.

Dear Councilmember Huizar,

My wife and I own a short term rental property located in South Carthay Circle and have serious concerns about the Home Sharing Ordinance in its current form. We do not live at the property as my 92 year old mother in law now lives with us because of health and safety (fall risk) issues. The money generated from the short term rentals helps us cover the costs associated with her care. But that is only part of the story.

To fully appreciate our concern, I believe it is important to know more about our property. It is a 1930s duplex that is beautiful and extremely well maintained. We love it. No expense is spared in our upkeep of this property. It's originality is preserved (tiffany windows, doors and skylight) as are the original architecture accents and wood floors. We still have the original fixtures and even antique O'Keefe stoves in the units. We have a landscaped backyard with a water fountain. The units are also furnished with estate furniture. Quite frankly, we take pride in the ownership of our duplex. So, first and foremost, we have a strong desire to control the use of and to preserve the historic beauty of the property. Forcing us to transform the units to traditional long term rentals will destroy our ability to do so. We would have no control over the units for long periods of time as all control and access are given up in traditional rentals. This causes us grave concern. Furthermore, ownership of long term rentals promotes deferred maintenance and neglect as there is no reason to spend money on upkeep beyond what is necessary. So this would be a loss to our neighborhood.

It is also important to note that we rent to tourists visiting Los Angeles which helps generate revenues for local business and tax revenue for the city and state. And we love it meeting people. We meet families from Paris, Italy, Germany, China, Canada, Egypt, Israel, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Mexico, Spain, Brazil, Argentina and, of course, other parts of the United States. Many families also come for weddings as they have family here, graduations (UCLA, USC, Loyola) or to be near Temple Beth Am for the high holidays (we are walking distance to the temple). We truly enjoy this experience.

Additionally, our next door neighbor is a stay at home mother and works for us. She uses the additional income to help pay medical bills as her husband is currently fighting cancer. She will suffer from the loss of this income should we be forced to end our short term rentals. Similarly, our cleaning lady relies upon our business. Additionally, we employ gardeners, plumbers, painters and a variety of other small businesses to keep our property in tiptop shape. All of these businesses would suffer if short term rentals like ours are severely restricted or forced out of business.

Another consideration is that we have never had any complaints about our guests. (And I suspect this is true for a majority of short term rental owners.) We restrict the number of people who can stay at the property and forbid parties or commercial use. So we are mindful of our neighbors and, of course, our next door neighbor is our "boots on the ground" to ensure that there are no problems. Moreover, our guests usually only use one vehicle which helps reduce traffic congestion in the city. It is quite unusual for a family in Los Angeles to only have one car. I think it is also important to note that having a long term tenant is no guarantee that there

will no problems with their use of the property. So I believe the argument that severely restricting short term rentals will eliminate such issues is misplaced.

Similarly, I seriously doubt that short term rentals effect the availability of affordable housing. In our situation, the market value of our units is \$4,500 - \$5,000, a month. In contrast, our net income from short term rentals is less than what we would get if the units were rented out as long term rentals but that is fine with us as we prefer to have control over the property and interact with all the great tourists visiting us. So in conclusion, our particular type of property (duplex in a high rental market) has little or no impact on affordable housing. I believe a much bigger issue is all the high value developments being constructed in Los Angeles without any allocation of units for affordable housing. I believe measures like JJJ are a better solution to address this problem.

For all of these reasons, I hope you will agree to some degree that the Home Sharing Ordinance is not the right answer. It is too restrictive and will not have the desired impact. It will hurt rather than help the local economy and unfairly targets citizens like my wife and me who manage our property in a responsible manner and simply wish to exercise our rights in a reasonable manner as property owners. I welcome the opportunity to meet you or your community liaison to discuss this matter further.

Dear Councilman Huizar:

I am writing this letter to you and members of the City Council and LA Housing Department to provide my own feedback, after years of successfully working in my neighborhood to provide short-term rentals, as to how to best consider the creation of ordinances designed to participation in this exciting, vibrant and growing aspect of our city's economy. I refer to the community of long-term LA residents who have created well run, desirable, clean, neighborhood-friendly vacation homes. Please excuse the length of this email, but I am passionate about this case. I have spent a lot of time writing this email, and I hope you and your staff will read it!

FRONT AND CENTER: OUR PRIVACY CONCERNS

I recently spoke in front of the Planning Commission and, firstly and most importantly, expressed grave concerns about the abrogation of our privacy rights if the City Council crafts an ordinance that forces the extraction of personal information and data about our businesses. As has been noted far more cogently than I can do here, this is a serious violation of our basic rights to conduct our own business without undue government interference, and has been the subject of many law suits that are currently making their way through the courts. Many more are certain to come if this absurdly restrictive ordinance passes, costing the City considerably to prosecute these, when it really is quite needless. We can accomplish our goals for both sides without such suits, and with fairer provisions.

THE SHARED ECONOMY IS A PERMANENT AND FLOURISHING ECONOMY FOR LOS ANGELES

A word about my situation: I have two apartments in a duplex in Los Angeles, which I bought in 2001. I had been a journalist for 25 years, and this was about the time that the journalism industry started crashing because the old business models were completely disrupted by the internet economy. Such disruption is natural in the digital economy, and most of us long-term journalists understood this and, ultimately, adapted to it. This is what we are asking the City to do now, with regards to the STR issue, at this crucial junction in the development of this economy.

I believe that any truly aware and involved citizen these days realizes that the shared economy is a fundamental economy and is not going away. The horse has long since left that stable. Today, we are a vibrant, healthy, hard-working, tremendously helpful community providing hospitality to hundreds of thousands of travelers around the world as well as locally to LA city residents. Yes, many are actually residents of LA, some of whom are taking stay-cations or need places to go while their houses are fixed or built.

Are STR's harming more than they are helping communities? Are we causing fires on properties right and left? Are we causing severe neighborhood, noise and disruption and vandalism in any way, shape or form more so than long-term rental properties?

SHORT-TERM RENTAL PROPERTIES AND THEIR INTEGRATION WITH OUR COMMUNITIES

My experience has shown me, and others, that the great majority of vacation rentals are integrating seamlessly with their neighborhoods. To a person, my friends and associates who are short-term renting can vouch that our properties are — and I say this with utmost sincerity and honesty — safer, clearer, and more neighborhood-friendly than when we were renting our properties out long-term. These properties are better maintained, and the tenants better behaved, than when the properties are exclusively used for long-term tenancy.

None of our short-term tenants, for example, are allowed to play music or have parties, and they don't. Why not? Because, in a global short-term rental community that is more than 10 years old and has progressed through growing pains and much self-critique, they are aware of the boundaries that compose that community. They know, for example, that they would be likely to forfeit their complete security deposit if they did create disruption or damage, and which could amount to hundreds of dollars.

Thus, they have a significant stake in the game — an economic and as well as a social stake that creates a very special and useful boundary. They know that we can post reviews of tenants as tenants can also post review of us, and in this way keeping both parties good citizens in the business. This is one important reason why the system works so well.

As the owner of a RSO duplex, I have had long-term renters for 7 years prior to joyously evolving to short-term renting. I can say without any hesitation at all that the result has been significantly less stress on ourselves, as well as on our property and the neighborhood, than we experienced with our long-term renters. Those renters, by the way, virtually ruined two sets of hardwood floors and created regular noise with frequent music-blasting during their outdoor parties.

None of our short-term tenants are allowed to play music and don't. Why? Because they would be likely to forfeit their complete security deposit if they did, which can amount to hundreds of dollars. Thus they have a significant stake in the game — an economic and as well as a social stake, since we can post reviews of tenants as tenants can also post review of us - in making sure they themselves behave well. That's truly why the system works so well.

Through our homes which we offer to travelers, our vacation renters can and do regularly integrate with the neighbors in our community. We have even entertained our neighbors with our renters, if both are lucky enough to get to know and appreciate one another. This is a far cry from what those on the other "side" of this debate would claim — that we are actually "destroying" our neighborhoods. Neighborhoods that most of us truly love and have helped develop. As our community has steadily developed higher and more measurable quality levels and customer service through the increased reliance on customer reviews and word of mouth, we have actually become the envy of many other Los Angeles businesses.

THE OUTLIERS DO NOT AND SHOULD NOT DEFINE THE ISSUE

Yes, of course we have our “outliers” as any community does — folks whose tenants, on rare occasions, disturb the neighborhood in an irresponsible manner. And their voices should be heard, and are being heard. But not at the expense of hearing the quieter voices — those of us who are struggling to pay our own rents and mortgages through our entrepreneurial business efforts.

It is sometimes difficult for those of us who truly love and support STRs to be heard over the angry shouters and yellers. What is most often heard by the City and the media are the opponents who organize out of anger and envy, rather than attempting to understand why our business and work and to share rational and mutual neighborly concerns.

In fact, envy and anger are, understandably, a large part of the STR dynamic here. Somehow, this emotional side of the issue has become the fuel itself for the anti-STR campaign. Two of the most vocal opponents in Venice, both of whom I know, have said to me or to my partner that they personally wish they had thought of short-term renting to high-quality clients years ago. What they may not realize is that it is not an easy and takes a great deal of careful curating and concern. But these are exactly the qualities that neighborhood landlords should develop and nurture, and which the Housing Department should, in turn, encourage, nurture, and evolve — and not hastily set about creating laws to delegitimize it.

Despite all the shouting and media manipulation the anti-STR lobby has impressively manifested, I hope you will consider the low percentage of neighborhood complaints overall for short-term rental properties. If you do, you’ll see that our neighborhoods and our City are already successfully adapting to this new economy. Hosts are adapting, too, perhaps more rapidly than anyone. We have seen a great increase in 5-star reviews in the STR business, because hosts recognize that if we don’t provide superb service that is respectful to guests and neighbors, no one would take the risk of staying at short-term rentals. You will also find that many people, older travelers and women especially, feel SAFER renting a person’s home.

We offer, for example, every guest who comes and stays with us special orientation booklets with our personal recommendations of every cafe, grocery store, boutique, bike rental and bus stop in the area. I believe we are far more neighborhood-firmedly and neighborhood-involved than any hotel could possibly be. \

SHORT-TERM RENTAL AFFECT ON INVENTORY OF AFFORDABLE PROPERTY

I would also like to briefly address the issue of us taking up valuable long-term property in the westside beach area: The beach community is obviously some of the highest-priced areas in Los Angeles, much of which is already taken up by hotels, the lobby for which is fighting hard NOT to have STR’s enter their territory. But truly, I believe there is no reason the City should not allow STR’s to be in tourist-friendly and the most tourist-valuable areas as well, especially those of us who pay our Transient Occupancy Taxes, the same as the hotels do.

The Southern California beaches are a prime location for kids, families, tourists and visitors of all stripes and varieties. A growing number of this demographic wants and seeks other options for enjoying their stays other besides impersonal, corporate-tyled hotels. Obviously, long-term

renters will not always be able to afford the high-priced beach areas. I believe tourist-areas should be given more breaks for short-term renters for this very reason, because they cater to a market that tourists truly desire.

Such hospitality is possible precisely because of this new, disruptive and exciting internet age. And if the City is wise in its crafting of its ordinance, it can to gain from new sources of tax revenue administered in a fair and considered manner.

UNFAIRNESS FOR RSO OWNERS

Another note: As a conscientious and successful owner of an RSO duplex who has had years of experience in both long and short-term renting, I certainly do not believe any new ordinance should de-factor make it illegal for RSOs to participating in the short-term rental economy. I have no choice in how my house is zoned, but I do have a choice is how well it's run, maintained, and integrated with our neighborhood. Rather than painting all RSO with the same broad brush, I would strongly recommend applying that brush selectively. Find out which of us have been providing the best services, with the least problems, and with a willingness to pay our Transient Occupancy Taxes. Those of us who meet at least these criterial should be given a fair chance to continue our business, providing we are taxed and, if need be, inspected like any similar business.

THE FAIR WAY TO MAKE AN UNFAIR MOVE

Finally, one which I am not eager to make. If indeed it ends up that the City does in fact, do the "wrong" thing and proceed to make our vibrant and helpful business illegal, please be aware that we have our obligations to travelers to the Los Angeles area, some of whom have booked more than 6 months in advance, and have planned their travel itineraries and bought their airline ticket based on our reservations. Is the City simply going to jump-start an effort to shut everyone down as soon as possible? Please, take the time to consider the fallout to thousands of our clients who have planned their trips and are to experience Los Angeles in a more intimate and friendly home setting, and have put their trust and faith in us.

Thus: any ordinance denying short term rentals should NOT go into affect for at least one year, so that we can have time to adjust and let our clients know of this situation, which we can only hope will evolve in a more enlightened fashion in the future,

I should hope, however, that it will not come to this. I should hope that the enlightened way to treat a growing and contributing part of the LA community and this new economy is not to disrupt this economic disruption by banning it, but rather to better understand it and help nurture its best qualities and better its weakest ones. In the end, the only thing that should be "disruptive," in a negative sense, is an undue degree of ignorance, anger and misunderstanding that we are all, as LA residents, hoping with this ordinance, to put behind us.

The shared economy is, to repeat myself, here to stay. I believe future generations will look to these early regulations and laws by the City as, hopefully, a measure of the its enlightened,

nuanced approach to an economy and a growing community. A community that in itself is surely one of the best neighbors any city could ask for.

Dear Councilmember Huizar,

As a homeowner, an Angelino, and an advocate of STR's, I would like to share my thoughts regarding the proposed ordinance.

I believe that the "Home Sharing" or "Short Term Rental" ordinance as presented is contradictory in many ways. By its name, it is referred to as "Home Sharing", thus, we hosts that are sharing our homes occasionally should not be treated as a Hotel, nor subject to the City's TOT "Hotel Tax".

Perhaps the solution is to charge the TOT on STR's that are NOT the primary residence of the Host, but that is a house, condominium, or apartment strictly being used as a short-term rental. Or, charging the Hotel Tax on rentals of less than 30 days.

Furthermore, if it is the tax that the City is interested in, as it appears it is, then why limit the number of days that a property can be rented out each year? That would be completely contradictory to the goal.

If hosts must be registered as a business, how can the City limit the number of days per year that such a business can be operated? This proposal is also contradictory. Either we are a business, and must register, pay the tax, then as such, we should be allowed to operate our business every day of the year as ANY OTHER BUSINESS is able to do. If we are going to be treated as a merely a "Home Sharing Host" (which I, and so many are), then we should not be treated as a hotel, and not subjected to the Hotel Tax. I occasionally "share" my home with out of town visitors, visitors that want an alternative to a hotel experience and the ability to have a home environment without having to dine out 3 meals per day, making a stay in Los Angeles cost prohibitive to most. A home also allows guests to "host" their own relatives that they have come to Los Angeles to visit that a hotel room would not provide. Clearly, this home sharing a few times per year is not running a business like a hotel, and should be treated as such.

I understand that purchasing properties, or turning apartments into STR's may adversely affect the long term rental market, however, I do not believe that using one's primary residence as a STR affects the long term housing market. By definition, it is our

home, a primary residence, and thus it not taking a long-term rental property off the market.

I request that the ordinance be consistent. Either allow us to occasionally share our "homes" with guests and not be treated like a business, or treat us COMPLETELY like a business, with registration, TOT, and no limit on the number of days that the home can be shared.

Dear Councilmember Huizar,

I received a copy of the letter below which I am sure you have seen by now. As a host of a short term rental and a traveler who uses short term rental for business and pleasure, I agree with just about everything that is said in the letter. I would however like to add a few of my own opinions, observations and thoughts.

Affordable housing: As a Realtor, I don't think I have to tell you, this is almost non existent in LA for many people but eliminating short term rentals for the most part would not add more properties for sale or rent to the equation. Our house, guest units or spare rooms would not be added to the housing stock if we did not rent them out short term. They would be used for family, friends and guests when not rented.

Are there some abuses? yes. Rental units that fall under rent control and are being rented out by a second party for short terms could be perceived as a problem but don't throw the "baby out with the bath water". Those of us who own our homes and rent the house, a guest unit or room should not be lumped into one big "short term rental" category and those units could be rented out in any one of three different ways, house, guest unit or room.

The 180 day limit: As noted above, this would not really change the housing stock.

Party Houses: Are there some? yes, I suppose there are but this has been greatly exaggerated. I know that in the years we have rented, we have never had a problem or complaint. It would be recommended that some consequences be created based upon reasonable complaints. Three strikes and you are out ! As a Realtor I can also tell you that we get lots of complaints about **full time** neighbors who own or rent who are too loud and party all the time. We have an agreement and rules that we enforce and tell the guest where to park, what noise levels are acceptable and the maximum number of guests allowed on the property.

Parking: Short term renters usually have one car or no car at all. Full time residents typical have one, often times two cars.

Who stays: The letter below makes a very good point that many of the people who come to LA, would not come if they had to stay in a hotel, would not stay as long and or would not bring their family. We have had families and often times parents, children or grandchildren stay with us while they are visiting family members in the area. Most of them would not be able to do this if it weren't for the short term rental. due to the cost and logistics and some people simply do not feel comfortable in hotels.

RE: Support for Short Term Rentals

Dear Councilmember Huizar,

As 28 year homeowners on Trolleyway in Playa del Rey, we would like to convey our viewpoint regarding the pending Short Term Rental ordinance.

We have lived here off and on for the last 28 years. Six years ago, after living in Colorado for 16 years raising our two daughters, we came back to take care of my elderly mother, who had fallen and broken her hip. Our long time tenants were 'Legally Relocated' through LAHCD (with relocation fees of \$9,300 paid to the tenants), in order for us to have a place to live. Shortly after, my dad passed away, leaving us with the responsibility of my mother's care. Occasionally, we have rented our property here to travel to Colorado, where we still have property and business dealings. This situation has put a strain on our finances, and therefore, we cannot afford to leave our property vacant when we travel, and cannot rent it full time since we wouldn't have a place to live when we come back. This way of life is challenging for us, however, we don't see another alternative at this point in time. The ability to rent Short Term has allowed us to take care of our responsibilities in both places and is our main source of income, at this time, since we are retired. In addition, since we are not currently renting our duplex long term, we recently were able to rent our unit for 4 months to a family displaced by the Porter Ranch gas leak, relieving them of having to live in a hotel for 2 months prior.

We realize that some short term rental hosts/managers, do not run their businesses responsibly, which sometimes result in issues and complaints from surrounding neighbors, however, we personally, have had more issues and problems with long term renters than short term renters. While living in Colorado in the nineties, we frequently received phone calls from our neighbors, regarding our long term renters, with noise issues and parties, etc.

In our neighborhood in particular, we have had a notably breakdown in our 'sense of community' due to the actions of a few who are against str's.

We have hosted some of the most wonderful families from all around the world, and others here on business. Many have returned, since they love the small town community feel of Playa del Rey. They eat in our restaurants, shop in our stores and support our local economy.

Though we welcome fair regulations of short term rentals, we feel, as written, it is very restrictive and would eliminate most STR's in our neighborhood, and only create more problems and complications for the city and Str hosts. We would like to address the specific items in the ordinance that concern us.

We feel the 180 day limit is overly restrictive and unnecessary. Since we travel back and forth to Colorado to manage our business there, we are not able to rent our unit long term, and we need a place to live here in LA when we are caring for our elderly mother. As long as all the other requirements are met, i.e., managing STR's responsibly, screening guests (who are mostly families and not party type people), limiting the number of guests, advising and enforcing noise issues, parking and trash rules, registering and paying TOT taxes (which we have done since 2012), we feel there should be no limit to the number of days.

Our property is on the beach, and has never been considered 'affordable housing'. Beach houses have been rented to vacationers for decades and is now part of the new 'sharing economy', and here to stay, whether regulated or not. **Prohibiting units subject to RSO would essentially eliminate most STR's in our neighborhood**, and since we are currently owner occupied and cannot rent our unit long term, we recommend deleting this restriction, or at the very least, grandfathering in those who are already operating STR's and do not currently have long term renters.

The enforcement of data sharing by rental platforms raises privacy and constitutional issues and the fines set forth in the ordinance are extreme and will only force hosts to go underground with their business and not comply.

Based on the issues above, we respectfully request the city amend the current STR draft ordinance regarding the cap on number of days, prohibiting RSO properties from operating and the fines and data sharing items.

This keeps old homes in far better condition which benefits everyone! This is not a business model that will make us RICH but it is a meaningful business.
