

CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION and COMMUNICATION FROM CHAIR, TRADE, COMMERCE, AND TOURISM COMMITTEE relative to the proposed Non-Exclusive Pipeline Right-of-Way License Agreement with ExxonMobil Oil Corporation for an underground fuel pipeline and related surface facilities at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX).

Recommendations for Council action:

1. ADOPT the determination by the Board of Airport Commissioners (Board) that the proposed action is exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as provided in Article III, Class 1 (18)(c) of the Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines.
2. APPROVE the five (5)-year Non-Exclusive Pipeline Right-of-Way License Agreement with ExxonMobil Oil Corporation.
3. CONCUR with the Board's action of December 18, 2014 by Resolution No. 25586 authorizing the Executive Director, Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA), to execute the Non-Exclusive Pipeline Right-of-Way License Agreement with ExxonMobil Oil Corporation for an underground fuel pipeline and related surface facilities at LAX.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The City Administrative Officer (CAO) reports that approval of the proposed pipeline right-of-way license agreement with ExxonMobil will have no impact on the City's General Fund; neither will it affect LAWA's capital or operating budgets. Approval of the subject right-of-way license agreement complies with LAWA's adopted Financial Policies.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At a regular meeting held on January 27, 2015, your Trade, Commerce and Tourism Committee Chair considered a LAWA transmittal relative to Non-Exclusive Pipeline Right-of-Way License Agreement with ExxonMobil Oil Corporation for a term of five years to continue the operation of a 31,434 square foot eight-inch diameter underground fuel delivery pipeline, and associated surface accessories (e.g., valves, pipes, manholes, inlets, vaults), supplying Jet A fuel (for commercial airliners) to LAX. The pipeline supplies an LAX bulk fuel storage facility on World Way West by way of a right-of-way along Imperial Highway.

An opportunity for public comment was held. After a brief discussion, the Committee Chair moved to approve the recommendations contained in the transmittal. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
