

GRYD Mission & Goals

Our mission is to strengthen community & family resilience to the influence of gangs by fostering private/public collaborations and supporting community based prevention and intervention services.

- Reduce gang joining among youth at highest risk.
- Reduce gang involvement among youth & young adults in gangs.
- Promote proactive peace-making efforts; respond to incidents of violence.
- Support transition of incarcerated juveniles re-entering communities upon release.
- Improve communication across agencies, community organizations & residents.
- Connect gang crime victims & their families to resources and services.

GRYD Zone Expansion

- ▶ Data-driven analysis
- ▶ High level of violence outside old boundaries
- ▶ Redrawn to maximize coverage & add key RDs

Crime Category	Prior Zones	FY15-16 Zones
Part 1 & 2 Gang-Related Crime	45%	73%
Domestic Violence	34%	56%
Overall Violent Crime	35%	61%
Overall Homicides	38%	71%
Gang-Related Homicides	43%	80%

GRYD Zone Expansion

Prevention & Intervention funded equally

More community intervention workers

Increase in intervention worker salary

Higher percentage of budgets to client services

Serving more youth & families across the City

Permanent Juvenile Re-Entry


- ▶ Serve juveniles & their families from incarceration
- ▶ Helps youth make successful transition to communities
- ▶ Currently serves Southeast, Northeast, and 77th Zones
- ▶ Established partnerships with LA County Probation
- ▶ Will expand number of youth served this year

Rapid Response Intervention Team

- ▶ Reserve unit of intervention workers to respond to high profile events & incidents outside of zones
- ▶ Incidents outside City often spread to City
- ▶ Deploy workers who do not work for current agencies
- ▶ Regional approach & collaboration with County

Addressing Family Violence

- ▶ Partnership between GRYD and DART/DV Programs
- ▶ DV/Gang Nexus - recognizing overlap w/family violence
- ▶ Training for staff/providers recognize risk & support families
- ▶ GRYD & DART/DV service provide connection & cross referrals



Summer Night Lights



- ▶ Continues through August 28 at 32 sites
- ▶ Safe places for recreation at key parks and housing developments throughout the City
- ▶ Free meals, sports and arts programming
- ▶ Hundreds of jobs for community members
- ▶ Fall Friday Nights at key parks through private donations

2015 Procurement Process

- ▶ RFP for Prevention and Intervention released in March
- ▶ 100 proposals received
- ▶ 60 volunteer judges chosen from law enforcement, academia, and community
- ▶ Conflicts of interest rigorously checked
- ▶ Scoring/Interviews
- ▶ RFP re-issued for select zones
- ▶ Appeals
