The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: The Winnetka Neighborhood Council (WNC) supports Council File 15-0989-S47. The 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games are an unprecedented opportunity for the City of Los Angeles to showcase its global leadership in hosting world-class events. With millions of visitors, athletes, and international media arriving in the city, the successful execution of the Games depends on the timely and efficient development of critical infrastructure. Therefore, the WNC

supports the proposed motion, which will streamline and expedite the permitting and approval processes for Olympic-related projects. The motion focuses the City's efforts on infrastructure development by directing the Department of Building and Safety to create a dedicated Olympic Development Unit. The Unit will be tasked with managing and expediting development related to the games. The WNC also supports the proposed exemptions from city planning approval, zoning regulations, and permit processes for Olympic-related construction to streamline the building process. The WNC fully supports the motion and urges the Olympic Development Unit to also carefully consider strategies to extend the usefulness of permanent Olympic Games-related development for long-term uses once the Games have ended.
