The CIS process was enabled by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Motion to Condemn ICE Operations in Silver Lake and Greater Los Angeles

WHEREAS, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) has conducted operations affecting the Silver Lake community and throughout Los Angeles that have included warrantless raids, community surveillance, and arrests without proper judicial oversight;

WHEREAS, these operations have caused fear and trauma among residents, particularly immigrant and undocumented communities, regardless of citizenship status;

WHEREAS, such actions raise serious concerns about violations of constitutional protections, including the Fourth Amendment right against unreasonable searches and seizures and the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments guaranteeing due process of law;

WHEREAS, the Silver Lake community is home to a diverse population, including immigrants who contribute significantly to the social, cultural, and economic fabric of the neighborhood;

WHEREAS, the values of the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council include inclusion, equity, and the protection of civil and human rights;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council formally condemns ICE operations that violate due process, constitutional protections, and the dignity of individuals residing, working and going to school in, as well as visiting, our community;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council urges our city officials, including CD4 Councilmember Nithya Raman, CD13 Councilmember Hugo Soto-Martínez, Mayor Karen Bass, City Attorney Hydee Feldstein Soto and Police Chief Jim McDonnell, to investigate and oppose any ICE activities that undermine civil liberties, and to provide support and legal resources for affected residents;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council commits to working with local officials to ensure that Silver Lake remains a safe and welcoming community for all residents, workers, students and visitors, regardless of immigration status.
