Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary:

The North Westwood Neighborhood Council (NWWNC) supports efforts by the Los Angeles City Council (Council) to ensure proper planning and programming of Non-Venue Activations (NVAs) in relation to the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games (the Games).

As the future home of the 2028 Olympic Village, North Westwood will be at the heart of major tourist and commercial activity involving local, regional, national, and international stakeholders in the time periods leading up to, during, and after the Games. Accordingly, North Westwood anticipates significant involvement in the cultural, entertainment, and other participation opportunities comprising NVAs.

Recognizing that proper planning and programming of NVAs will require the procurement of a large number of goods and services, and that the City will face increased infrastructure demands as the region prepares for the Games, NWWNC urges the Council to implement measures that prioritize contracting with local businesses. Involvement in NVAs would allow North Westwood's local businesses (especially its small, underrepresented ones) to experience a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to advance their economic goals by providing services to residents and visitors alike during events occurring in their metaphorical backyards. Local, small, and underrepresented businesses across the board should have fair access to bid for services at NVAs and infrastructure improvements implemented by governmental agencies preparing for the Games.

To that end, NWWNC supports the instant Motion for the Council to instruct the Bureau of Contract Administration, the Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst, and the Chief Administrative Officer, with the assistance of the Economic and Workforce Development Department, Recreation and Parks, Los Angeles World Airports, and other relevant City Departments and other public entities (e.g., Metro and Los Angeles

County) to report within ninety (90) days with an assessment of procurement opportunities for local, small, and underrepresented business at NVAs in the City, procedures currently in place to support these businesses, and recommendations to coordinate, monitor, and enhance efforts to expand contracting opportunities for these businesses. Ideally, this would include neighborhood-specific findings to empower local governments in the Los Angeles area to inform strategic engagement with their respective stakeholders and organizers of the Games.
