Once transferred to the Department of Recreation and Parks from the General Services Department, we do not understand how the MRCA can donate State grant funding for the improvements on the land.

MRCA's involvement in construction issues clouds the contracting process, State grant fund accountability and (grant) responsibility for ongoing operations and maintenance funding. We do not understand how MRCA could apply for grant funds for property where they have no site control. It is not clear if the LA County Flood Control owns the land or just the easements.

Stormwater features are usually under compliance issues for the LA Municipal Separate Storm Sewer LAMS4 Order issued by the LA Regional Water Quality Control Board for water quality and water degradation issues. The city jurisdictions are the LA Department of Sanitation under the oversight of the Board of Public Works.

There are no California Building Codes for stormwater capture or stormwater treatment-only for graywater.

CEQA documentation should be prepared for the park.
