**DRAFT ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 22.806 OF THE LOS ANGELES

Honorable Members:

This Office has prepared and now transmits for your consideration the enclosed draft ordinance, approved as to form and legality. The draft ordinance amends Section 22.806 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) to authorize the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners to define community interest stakeholders in the Neighborhood Council system. If City Council adopts the ordinance, we recommend that Council also approve the enclosed resolution, so that the changes to the LAAC will be consistent and reflected in the Plan for a Citywide System of Neighborhood Councils.

Background and Summary of Ordinance Provisions

On September 28, 2015, City Council requested our Office to draft an ordinance authorizing the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (Commission) to further define a community interest stakeholder. A community interest stakeholder currently is a person who "affirms a substantial and ongoing participation within the neighborhood council's

boundaries....” (LAAC §22.811(a)(2).) The proposed draft ordinance authorizes the Commission to define the types and duration of contacts that a community interest stakeholder must have in order to demonstrate the person has “substantial and ongoing participation” within the community. In addition, the proposed ordinance amends Section 22.806 to ensure Subsection (b) is consistent with this ordinance.

Council Rule 38 Referral

A copy of the draft ordinance was sent, pursuant to Council Rule 38, to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment and the City Clerk with a request that all comments, if any, be presented directly to the City Council when this matter is considered.
