NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS/OCCUPANTS WITHIN A 500-FOOT RADIUS

You are hereby notified that the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee of the Los Angeles City Council will hold a public hearing on **Tuesday, February 16, 2016**, at approximately **2:30 p.m.** or soon thereafter in the Board of Public Works Edward R. Roybal Hearing Room 350, City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012, to consider Categorical Exemption and related California Environmental Quality Act findings, and an appeal filed by Alberto Avila, Top Gun Nightlife Group, Incorporated, dba: Cashmere Nightclub, aka: The Day After Nightclub (Representative: Michael D. Kolodzi, Esq., The Kolodzi Law Firm), from the entire determination of the Zoning Administrator, pursuant to the provisions of Section 12.27.1 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code, in requiring the discontinuance of the operation of a restaurant/nightclub with alcohol sales at the establishment known as Cashmere Nightclub, located at 6757-6763 West Hollywood Boulevard.

Any written correspondence delivered to the City Clerk before the City Council's final action on a matter will become a part of the administrative record. The time in which you may seek judicial review of any final action by the City Council is limited by California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6 which provides that an action pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.5 challenging the Council's action must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which the Council action becomes final.
