- What research and innovations are taking place in the power supply?
- What is the state of the water supply?
- What is the state of any emergency in the water supply?
- What research and innovations are taking place in the water supply?
- What management is in place?

LA River WATER RIGHTS have been adjudicated as PUEBLO RIGHTS to the City with LADWP's Board in control of those assets.

Why did the MAYOR (without Board of Water and Power Commissioners approval) support the use of LA RIVER WATER RIGHTS for an art project and use in surrounding State and City parks? State Water Board approved WATER RIGHTS to Lauren Bon and Metabolic Studio.

Will multiple owners of WATER RIGHTS trigger a state governance structure? Or will the possible Stormwater Capture Credit or Cap and Trade mechanism trigger some other oversight?

Full Disclosure is necessary before placing a measure on the ballot.
