

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the 2016 Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force Grant.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), or designee, to:
 - a. Retroactively apply for and accept the 2016 ICAC Task Force Grant in the amount of \$696,665 from the DOJ for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.
 - b. Negotiate and execute the cooperative agreement on behalf of the City, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form.
 - c. Negotiate and execute new or amended agreements with affiliated ICAC Task Force agencies, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form.

2. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to:
 - a. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit grant receipts in Fund No. 339/70.
 - b. Spend up to the grant amount of \$696,665 in accordance with the grant award agreement.
 - c. Appropriate \$696,665 to Appropriation Account No. 70M416 within Fund No. 339/70, for disbursement of the 2016 ICAC Task Force Continuation Program grant.

3. AUTHORIZE the Controller to:
 - a. Increase the grant receivable in Fund No. 339 by the amount of \$696,665.
 - b. Increase appropriations for 2016 ICAC Task Force Continuation Program as needed from Appropriation Account No. 70M416 in Fund No. 339/70, to Fund No. 100/70, account numbers and amounts as follows:

 - c. Authorize the LAPD to prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement the instructions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that approval of the above recommendations will have no additional impact on the General Fund. Acceptance of the grant is in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that one-time revenue is used for one-time expenses.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on December 6, 2016, your Public Safety Committee considered a CAO report relative to the 2016 ICAC Task Force Grant in the amount of \$696,665 from the DOJ for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. The CAO reports that the primary purpose of the DOJ ICAC Program is to ensure law enforcement agencies are equipped to quickly respond to, investigate, and prosecute incidents involving the exploitation of children and juveniles through the use of the Internet. The Los Angeles ICAC Task Force is comprised of a network of 55 law enforcement and prosecutorial agencies that work in concert to prevent, investigate and prosecute computer-facilitated crimes against children, particularly the exchange of child pornography and online solicitation for sexual purposes. After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations presented in the CAO transmittal, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
