SUMMARY

On September 1, 2016, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) notified the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) of an award of funds from the FY2016 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) for Advanced Marine Firefighter Training in the amount of \$71,915. The Federal cost-share is \$53,936 and the LAFD cost-share is \$17,979. The FY2016 PSGP is a cost-share reimbursement grant. The federal share of the grant is 75% with a 25% cost match provided by the LAFD. The performance period for the FY2016 PSGP is September 1, 2016 through August 31, 2019.

The purpose of the PSGP funding is to support National Preparedness Goals to strengthen the nation's critical infrastructure against risks associated with potential terrorist attacks through prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery mission areas. This specific grant addresses potential terrorist threats in the Los Angeles Port Area.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

That the Board:

1. Approve this report and forward to the Mayor and City Council for acceptance and authority to expend FY2016 Port Security Grant Program funding for Advanced Marine Firefighter Training.
2. Request that the Mayor and City Council:

- a. Authorize the Fire Chief to expend funds in the amount of \$71,915 from LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB in accordance with the FY2016 PSGP award, from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), for the performance period of September 1, 2016, through to August 31, 2019, and any extension of the performance period granted by FEMA.
- b. Authorize the LAFD to deposit reimbursement grant funds into Fund 335, Department 38, Account TBD.
- c. Authorize the LAFD to transfer reimbursement grant funds from Fund 335, Department 38, Account TBD to LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB.
- d. Authorize the Controller to transfer funds from LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB to General Fund 100, Department 38, Account 001098 (Variable Staffing), upon submission of proper documentation by LAFD of actual cost incurred from the Advanced Marine Firefighting Training Courses, subject to the review and approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO).
- e. Authorize the LAFD to prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the CAO, and authorize and instruct the Controller to implement the instructions.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no impact to the LAFD General Fund in FY2016-17. The LAFD will cover the expenditures up to \$71,915 through LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB. The FEMA will reimburse LAFD a total up to \$53,936 (75%); the required cost share up to \$17,979 (25%) will be absorbed by the LAFD.
