WHEREAS, Moore High School is a four-year comprehensive high school located in Moore, Oklahoma, a suburb south of Oklahoma City. Moore High School is one of the largest high schools in the state with a population of 2,185. The student body includes residents of South Oklahoma City as well as the city of Moore; and

WHEREAS, Moore High School started around the turn of the of the century, Moore High School has served the people of Moore, Oklahoma and the surrounding area since its establishment. The present campus was opened in 1968 and is set on a fifty-acre site. Moore High School was the original and only high school in Moore until 1988 when their sister school of Westmoore opened; and

WHEREAS, Moore is accredited by the North Central Association, the Oklahoma State Department of Education, the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Association, and High Schools That Work. Accredited classes are provided for students with disabilities and students on homebound. Internet courses and an alternative high school are also available as needed; and

WHEREAS, the Moore High School Fight Song reads: "*Moore, Moore, school we all adore, M-O-O-R-E. Red, Royal Blue, Faithful, always true, We'll be together, whatever the weather, Lions and Lionettes, too. Moore High, for you we'll always try, And may we bring honor to our school. We'll always fight, fight, fight, for victory. For MHS, we'll do or die;*" and

WHEREAS, the Moore High School – Graduating Class of 1978's Chant rang: "*We're so sexy, we're so great, we're the Class of '78!*"
