WHEREAS, Kevin Ocubillo embodies the Team Huizar can-do spirit and



RESOLUTION

South Central Los Angeles Ministry Project

WHEREAS, South Central Los Angeles Ministry Project (SC LAMP) was founded by eight congregations of catholic religious women in the wake of the 1992 riots; and

WHEREAS, South Central LAMP's founding members, a group of caring religious women, canvassed the streets of South Central Los Angeles to offer support to women and children in need; and

WHEREAS, the agency responded to the need of a large community of immigrant mothers who didn't understand the public school system or how to support their children's educational development; and

WHEREAS, this organization has made it its mission to provide a supportive, nurturing environment for economically disadvantaged women and their families, by offering educational programs that empower them to reach their full potential, build self-esteem, and strengthen mutual interdependent relations; and

WHEREAS, South Central LAMP, has made a significant impact in the lives of thousands of South Central's most vulnerable families over the course of 25 years; and

WHEREAS, South Central LAMP, offers free Early Childhood Education for children ages (0-5) in order to prepare them for kindergarten and their academic future; and

WHEREAS, the goal of South Central LAMP's English as a Second Language program is to equip mothers with the language proficiency necessary for personal, vocational, academic and citizenship goals so they may participate fully in society to support and advocate for their children; and

WHEREAS, the agency actively engages mothers as partners in the development of their children for improved educational outcomes through their Parent-Child Interactive Literacy Activities (PCILA); and

WHEREAS, South Central LAMP, believes that strong mothers foster strong children, the agency empowers the women they serve by providing opportunities to increase their self-esteem, build relationships within their community, and advocate for themselves, their children and their families; and

WHEREAS, South Central LAMP's Family Advocacy program is designed to help parents develop personal and family goals, identify and address obstacles, and provides support, information, and referrals to vital community resources; and


WHEREAS, the agency is responding to the community's growing need by connecting the families to local immigration and legal centers, food pantries, physical and mental health resources, and faith based programs:
