Whereas, Prostate cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in men aside from skin cancer. With an estimated 26,120 fatalities, prostate cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer death in men; and

Whereas, The only well-established risk factors for prostate cancer are increasing age, African ancestry, a family history of the disease and certain inherited genetic conditions. African American men have one of the highest documented prostate cancer incidence rates in the world; and

Whereas, Early prostate cancer usually has no symptoms. Hence, early detection is key to prostate cancer survival. Advanced prostate cancer commonly spreads to the bones, which can cause pain in the hips, spine, ribs or other areas; and

Whereas, This year marks The Men's Cancer Network, Inc.'s ten-year anniversary in providing educational support for all cancers, with a focus on prostate cancer awareness and prevention, to underserved men in the City of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, Distinguished for their unique approach, The Men's Cancer Network, Inc. is committed to offering health screenings, educational field trips, transportation to cancer facilities, and a strong support network to educate and empower in the fight against cancer disparities; and





WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon retired from the Los Angeles Police Department after thirty-two years of dedicated service; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, has served with professionalism, pride and dedication in the following assignments: Recruit in Training Division, 77th Street Division, Harbor Division, Southeast Division, South Bureau Robbery-Apprehension Detail, South Bureau CRASH, Southwest Division, Southwest Vice, and Metropolitan Division where he earned a position in the Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, has served a total of twenty-four years and three months in Metropolitan Division, with twenty-two years and three months assigned to the elite SWAT team; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, as an Element Member, was instrumental in the successful completion of hundreds of crisis negotiations, barricaded suspect incidents, hostage rescues, and high-risk warrant services; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, was responsible for the security of the past six United States Presidents, and high-ranking foreign dignitaries during their visits to the Los Angeles area; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, was recognized and decorated with two Department Police Stars, two Police Commission Unit Citation Medals, and one Meritorious Unit Citation; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, in 1986 through 1989, was part of the Los Angeles Police Department's track team and participated in the Police Olympics. During his tenure, he also earned gold medals in the state and world games; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, was a member of the Los Angeles Police Department's Centurion Football team from 1996 through 1998, and earned "Rookie of the Year" in 1996; and

WHEREAS, Police Officer III+I Keith Bacon, during his career with the Los Angeles Police Department, received over one hundred commendations and letters of appreciation from thankful citizens and supervisors for his outstanding police service and dedication to the community which he proudly served:
