I am a Citizen for Los Angeles Wildlife and I oppose the Board of Public Works adoption of ENV-2015-1843-MND and its addendum, as well as their approval of a tree removal permit for 5 protected trees.

I was so encouraged when, in 2016, the City Council established the first Wildlife Habitat Linkage Zone between the 405 and 5 freeways. With this zone designated, the next step was to implement the new protection standards within this zone. But instead, after two years of waiting in vain for the protection standards to be implemented, in 2018, the Los Angeles Board of Public Works approved an 8,000+ sq. ft. single family home to be constructed over a creek in Nichols Canyon. This approval, which includes the removal of five protected trees, failed to adequately address the environmental impact the development would have on the creek habitat, as well as the connectivity this land provides between two large open space areas.

I am asking you to please revisit this disappointing and damaging approval, and while you are reconsidering, please delay any tree removal and/or preliminary work that would put the wishes of one family for an 8000 square foot single residence ahead of the welfare of all the animals who need the habitat for survival, and all the citizens of Los Angeles, who need the sanity-saving open spaces that are left to us.

The MND also did not address potentially adverse effects on habitat connectivity, as this land is acting as a wildlife corridor between two large open space habitat areas. The Tree Removal Permit for this project was granted prematurely, and no tree removal should take place before the City Council has heard our appeal.

I have lived in the Santa Monica Mountains since 1986 and have noticed a marked decrease of wild animals in the area, especially with the increased amounts of mega mansions that have been built in my neighborhood. I moved to the mountains because I wanted to enjoy the wild animals that live in the area and am dismayed with the impact of these large houses and other developments have had.
