That would cost Los Angeles an estimated 14,740 housing units. It would also widen the wealth gap by both providing passive income to already-wealthy homeowners and by driving up housing prices (both rental and home ownership). This is not a drill!

I urge you to reject the Vacation Rental Ordinance, Council File Number: 18-1246, to allow second homes to be used as short-term rentals and listed on platforms like Airbnb and VRBO. We need MORE aggressive enforcement of the current home-sharing ordinance, not more loopholes that convert affordable housing into illegal hotels in our neighborhoods.
